2023 ASSEMBLY BILL 628

November 8, 2023 - Introduced by Representatives Schraa, Pronschinske, Mursau, Myers, Behnke, Bodden, Brandtjen, Edming, Goeben, Green, O'CONNOR, ORTIZ-VELEZ, RETTINGER, ROZAR, SCHMIDT, SORTWELL, TITTL and TRANEL, cosponsored by Senators Wanggaard and L. Johnson. Referred to Committee on Jobs, Economy and Small Business Development.

AUTHORS SUBJECT TO CHANGE

AN ACT to create 100.75 of the statutes; relating to: requiring retail sellers to 1 accept cash and providing a penalty.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires a retailer who sells goods or services from a physical location to accept cash as payment in a transaction amounting to \$2,000 or less during a face-to-face sale with a consumer, unless the person is otherwise prohibited by law from accepting cash. A retailer who violates this requirement is subject to a civil forfeiture of \$200 to \$5.000.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **Section 1.** 100.75 of the statutes is created to read:
- 100.75 Retail sellers required to accept cash. A person who sells goods or services at retail from a physical location may not refuse to accept cash in exchange for those goods or services if the transaction amounts to \$2,000 or less and is a face-to-face sale with a consumer, unless the person is otherwise prohibited by law

from accepting cash for the goods or services being sold. The department, or any district attorney upon notifying the department, may commence an action in the name of the state to recover a forfeiture to the state of not less than \$200 and not more than \$5,000 for each violation of this section. In lieu of or in addition to a forfeiture, the department, or any district attorney upon notifying the department, may seek a temporary or permanent injunction restraining any person from violating this section.
