2013 ASSEMBLY BILL 633

January 21, 2014 – Introduced by Representatives Krug, Kulp, Bernier, Spiros, T. Larson and Wright, cosponsored by Senators Schultz and Lassa. Referred to Committee on Natural Resources and Sporting Heritage.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a resident of this state is eligible for an annual fishing license at a reduced fee if the person applying for the license produces a certificate from a licensed physician or optometrist stating that his or her sight is impaired to the degree that he or she cannot read ordinary newspaper print with or without corrective glasses, or produces evidence showing that he or she is receiving social security or other federal disability benefits or that he or she is a veteran receiving federal disability compensation for a non-service-related disability.

Under this bill, a certificate stating that an applicant's sight is impaired to the degree that he or she cannot read ordinary newspaper print with or without corrective glasses no longer qualifies a person to receive an annual fishing license at a reduced fee. Instead, the bill allows a resident holder of a Class C permit to be eligible for an annual fishing license at a reduced fee as long as the permit will not expire before the end of the effective period of the annual fishing license. DNR must issue a Class C permit to any applicant who is legally blind.

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The bill also makes a resident holder of a Class A permit eligible for an annual fishing license at a reduced fee as long as the permit will not expire before the end of the effective period of the annual fishing license. DNR must issue a Class A permit to an applicant who DNR determines has a permanent disability and is unable to walk or move about without a wheelchair, walker, or certain other mobility aids, or who is suffering significantly from lung disease or cardiovascular disease.

The bill also makes a resident holder of a Class B permit eligible for an annual fishing license at a reduced fee as long as the permit is issued for more than one year and will not expire before the end of the effective period of the annual fishing license. DNR must issue a Class B permit to an applicant with a temporary disability that restricts mobility or ambulation and who has either surgery or a cast on his or her leg, hip, or back. DNR may issue a Class B permit to an applicant with a temporary disability that restricts mobility or ambulation or to an applicant who is otherwise ineligible for a Class A or Class B permit if the issuance of a Class B permit complies with the intent of the statute that establishes these classes of permits for persons with disabilities.

Finally, the bill makes a resident holder of a Class D permit eligible for an annual fishing license at a reduced fee as long as the permit will not expire before the end of the effective period of the annual fishing license. DNR must issue a Class D permit to an applicant who has certain upper extremity impairments such as amputation, prosthesis, or loss of function of one or both arms, hands, or shoulders.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 29.024 (6) (c) 2. of the statutes is amended to read:

29.024 **(6)** (c) 2. Persons appointed under par. (a) 2. and 3., as well as the department, shall issue temporary disabled person fishing licenses under s. 29.193 (3m).

Section 2. 29.193 (title) of the statutes is amended to read:

29.193 (title) Approvals for disabled persons with disabilities.

SECTION 3. 29.193 (1m) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

29.193 (1m) (b) A disabled person with a disability who holds a current fishing license issued under this chapter or who is exempt from holding a fishing license under this chapter and who holds either a trolling permit issued under par. (a) or a

Class A permit issued under sub. (2) may fish or troll in the waters of this state using an electric motor. A person who assists the disabled person with a disability in the same boat may also fish or troll if he or she also holds a current fishing license or is exempt from holding a license. A person may use an electric motor under this subsection notwithstanding any ordinances enacted under s. 30.77 (3) that prohibit the use of motor boats on navigable waters. The use of such motor is subject to any rules promulgated by the department regarding the use of electric motors for fishing or trolling by disabled persons with disabilities.

Section 4. 29.193 (2) (b) 2. of the statutes is amended to read:

29.193 (2) (b) 2. An applicant shall submit an application on a form prepared and furnished by the department, which shall include a written statement or report prepared and signed by a licensed physician, a licensed chiropractor, or a licensed podiatrist prepared no more than 6 months preceding the application and verifying that the applicant is physically disabled has a physical disability.

SECTION 5. 29.193 (2) (c) 1. (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:

29.193 (2) (c) 1. (intro.) The department shall issue a Class A permit under this subsection to an applicant who is permanently disabled has a permanent disability, as determined by the department, in any of the following ways:

Section 6. 29.193 (2) (cr) 4. of the statutes is amended to read:

29.193 (2) (cr) 4. A person holding a current resident or nonresident deer hunting license and a Class D permit may hunt deer of either sex with a firearm only during a special season established by the department that is open for hunting deer with firearms by disabled persons with disabilities who hold a permit under this section.

for an annual disabled person fishing license that includes the evidence specified in		

sub. (3) (a), (b), or (c) and the applicable license fee and issuing fee, the
nongovernmental issuing agent shall issue, subject to s. 29.024 (2g), a temporary
disabled person fishing license to the applicant. The nongovernmental issuing agent
shall promptly forward all of the application materials for the annual fishing license
to the department for the department's review. A temporary fishing license issued
under this subsection is valid for 14 days after the date of issuance. If the department
denies the application for an annual fishing license, the department shall notify the
applicant within 30 days after the date the temporary fishing license is issued. If the
department approves the application, the department shall issue, subject to s. 29.024
(2g), the annual fishing license and mail it to the applicant within 30 days after the
date the temporary fishing license is issued. The department may not charge any
type of fee for issuing the annual fishing license, and the department may not refund
the applicable fees for the temporary fishing license if the department denies the

29.193 (5) (title) Group fishing license for the developmentally disabled persons with developmental disabilities.

SECTION 14. 29.559 (1) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

29.559 (1) (b) A person appointed under s. 29.024 (6) (a) 3. may retain the entire issuing fee for each temporary disabled person fishing license the person issues under s. 29.193 (3m) in order to compensate for services in issuing the license.

SECTION 15. 29.563 (3) (a) 7. of the statutes is amended to read:

29.563 (3) (a) 7. Annual or temporary fishing issued to a disabled person with a disability under s. 29.193 (3) (a) or (b) or (3m): \$6.25.

Section 16. 29.563 (3) (a) 9. of the statutes is amended to read:

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29.563 (3) (a) 9. Annual or temporary fishing issued to a disabled veteran with
<u>a disability</u> under s. 29.193 (3) (c) or (3m): \$2.25.
Section 17. Effective date.
