## 2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 827

January 12, 2018 - Introduced by Representatives KULP, HORLACHER, SPIROS, WICHGERS, RIPP and ROHRKASTE, cosponsored by Senator TESTIN. Referred to Committee on Agriculture.

\*\*\*AUTHORS SUBJECT TO CHANGE\*\*\*

1     **AN ACT** *to create* 20.115 (4) (fm) and 93.58 of the statutes; **relating to:** grants  
2             for obtaining farm tractor rollover protective structures and making an  
3             appropriation.

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### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

This bill requires the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection to make a grant to an organization that uses the grant funds to reimburse the costs of purchasing and installing rollover protective structures for farm tractors. Under the bill, an organization with a purpose of addressing human health and safety associated with rural and agricultural work, life, and environments receives the grant and must spend at least 70 percent of the grant funds to reimburse the costs of purchasing and installing rollover protective structures for farm tractors. The bill provides that for each reimbursement made, the organization must pay 70 percent of the first \$1,670 in purchase and installation costs and all of the costs in excess of \$1,670. The bill also requires the organization to report annually to DATCP on its expenditures of grant funds until all of the grant funds are expended.

8           **SECTION 2.** 20.115 (4) (fm) of the statutes is created to read:  
9           20.115 (4) (fm) *Farm tractor rollover protection grants.* The amounts in the  
10 schedule for grants under s. 93.58 (2).

11           **SECTION 3.** 93.58 of the statutes is created to read:

12           **93.58 Farm tractor rollover protection grants. (1) DEFINITIONS.** In this  
13 section:

14           (a) “Farm tractor” has the meaning given in s. 340.01 (16).

15           (b) “Rollover protective structure” means a structure installed on a farm tractor  
16 that protects a person operating a farm tractor from injuries caused by the  
17 overturning of the farm tractor and that meets the standard of specifications  
18 established by a national or international organization with a purpose of developing  
19 and publishing industrial standards.

20           **(2) GRANT PROGRAM.** (a) From the appropriation under s. 20.115 (4) (fm), the  
21 department shall provide grants to an organization with a purpose of addressing  
22 human health and safety associated with rural and agricultural work, life, and  
23 environments.

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1           (b) An organization receiving a grant under par. (a) shall expend not less than  
2           70 percent of the amount of the grant to reimburse, as provided under par. (c), the  
3           costs of purchasing and installing rollover protective structures.

4           (c) For each reimbursement made with funds received under par. (a), the  
5           organization shall pay the following amounts:

6           1. Seventy percent of the first \$1,670 of the cost of purchasing and installing  
7           a rollover protective structure.

8           2. One hundred percent of the cost of purchasing and installing a rollover  
9           protective structure in excess of \$1,670.

10          (d) An organization receiving a grant under par. (a) shall annually submit a  
11          report to the department describing the expenditures of the grant funds until all of  
12          the grant funds are expended.
