1 **Relating to:** the life and public service of Mary Lou (Rogers) Munts.

2 Whereas, Mary Lou (Rogers) Munts served six terms in the Wisconsin State
3 Assembly from 1973 to 1984 and was a leader in advancing the role of female
4 lawmakers and women in the state of Wisconsin; and

5 Whereas, Mary Lou Rogers was born on August 21, 1924, in Chicago, Illinois;
6 attended Swarthmore College in Pennsylvania; took a leave of absence to work on
7 the congressional campaign of Vernon O'Rourke; completed her undergraduate
8 studies and earned a master's degree in economics at the University of Chicago in
9 1947; and earned a law degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1976;

11 Whereas, Mary Lou Rogers married Raymond Munts in 1947 and together they
12 had four children; and

13 Whereas, she took part as an activist in critical times throughout United States
14 history, such as the civil rights movement and the Vietnam War protests; and
