1	<b>Relating to:</b> commending emergency response personnel across the state for their
2	work during the July 2019 severe weather incidents.
3	Whereas, severe storms swept across the state in late July 2019, flooding roads,
4	downing trees, and leaving over 273,000 residents without power; and
5	Whereas, at least 19 tornadoes touched down in the state and straight-line
6	winds occurred, causing significant damage; and
7	Whereas, local fire and police departments, the Red Cross, the Salvation Army,
8	the National Guard, utility crews, public works crews, state agency personnel, and
9	volunteers came forward to assist in the recovery; and
10	Whereas, members of the Wisconsin Legislature thank state residents who
11	pitched in to support their neighbors and communities; and
12	Whereas, members of the Wisconsin Legislature also express their deepest
13	sympathies to those whose property was lost or damaged during the storms; and
14	Whereas, the legislature hopes for the state's speedy recovery from the storms;
