## **SENATE BILL 18**

October 11, 2011 – Introduced by COMMITTEE ON SENATE ORGANIZATION, by request of Governor Scott Walker and Representative Radcliffe. Referred to Committee on Education.

1 AN ACT to create 118.33 (1m) of the statutes; relating to: authorizing a school

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board to grant a vocational high school diploma.

## Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a school board may not grant a high school diploma to any pupil unless the pupil has earned at least 4 credits of English, 3 credits of social studies, 2 credits of science, 2 credits of mathematics, 1.5 credits of physical education, and 0.5 credits of health education.

This bill authorizes a school board to grant a vocational high school diploma to a pupil who has not earned the academic credits specified above but has earned a sufficient number of credits in vocational subjects, as determined by the school board, if the Department of Public Instruction has approved the school district's vocational curriculum.

## The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 118.33 (1m) of the statutes is created to read:
118.33 (1m) In lieu of granting a high school diploma under sub. (1), a school
board may grant a vocational high school diploma to a pupil who has not earned the
academic credits required under sub. (1) but has earned a sufficient number of

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- 1 credits in vocational subjects, as determined by the school board, if the department
- 2 has approved the school district's vocational curriculum.
