## 2017 SENATE BILL 331

June 23, 2017 - Introduced by Senators VINEHOUT and CARPENTER, cosponsored by Representatives CONSIDINE, BILLINGS, CROWLEY, POPE, SUBECK, SPREITZER, OHNSTAD, BERCEAU, C. TAYLOR, SARGENT, SHANKLAND, BROSTOFF and ZEPNICK. Referred to Committee on Sporting Heritage, Mining and Forestry.

1     **AN ACT relating to:** monitoring industrial sand mining and processing  
2             operations and making an appropriation.

*Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

This bill authorizes eight full time equivalent positions to the Department of Natural Resources for monitoring industrial sand mining and processing operations and provides funding for those positions from the environmental fund.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

3             **SECTION 1. Fiscal changes.**

4             (1) INDUSTRIAL SAND OPERATION MONITORING. In the schedule under section  
5             20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of natural  
6             resources under section 20.370 (2) (mq) of the statutes, the dollar amount for fiscal  
7             year 2017-18 is increased by \$900,000 to increase the authorized FTE positions for  
8             the department by 8.0 SEG positions for monitoring industrial sand mining and

1 processing operations. In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for  
2 the appropriation to the department of natural resources under section 20.370 (2)  
3 (mq) of the statutes, the dollar amount for fiscal year 2018-19 is increased by  
4 \$900,000 to provide funding for the positions authorized in this subsection.

5 **SECTION 2. Effective date.**

6 (1) This act takes effect on the day after publication, or on the 2nd day after  
7 publication of the 2017 biennial budget act, whichever is later.
