## **2021 SENATE BILL 53**

January 28, 2021 – Introduced by Senators JACQUE, WANGGAARD, FELZKOWSKI, MARKLEIN and NASS, cosponsored by Representatives BRANDTJEN, SPIROS, ARMSTRONG, CALLAHAN, DITTRICH, EDMING, KNODL, MOSES, MURPHY, ROZAR, WICHGERS and ZIMMERMAN. Referred to Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

1 AN ACT to amend 943.10 (1m) (intro.) of the statutes; relating to: entering

certain places with intent to commit battery and providing a penalty.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, it is a Class F felony to enter a dwelling or certain other places with intent to steal or commit a felony therein. Under the bill, it is also a Class F felony to enter one of those places with intent to commit battery that is misdemeanor battery rather than felony battery. Under current law, the penalty for a Class F felony is a fine not to exceed \$25,000 or imprisonment not to exceed 12 years and six months, or both.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a report.
