



2023 SENATE BILL 768

December 8, 2023 - Introduced by Senators KNODL and STROEBEL, cosponsored by Representatives NOVAK, ARMSTRONG, BROOKS, GOEBEN, GUNDRUM, S. JOHNSON, MICHALSKI, MOSES, MURPHY, MURSAU, RETTINGER, SCHMIDT and TRANEL. Referred to Committee on Transportation and Local Government.

1 **AN ACT** *to renumber and amend* 101.16 (2); and *to create* 101.16 (2) (b) of the
2 statutes; **relating to:** prohibiting certain rules related to dispensing liquefied
3 petroleum gases for vehicle fuel purposes.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill prohibits the Department of Safety and Professional Services from promulgating any rule that does any of the following regarding liquefied petroleum gases used for vehicle fuel purposes: 1) prohibits self-service dispensing; or 2) requires completion of training to dispense. Under current law, DSPS must promulgate rules to establish rules and standards for the design, construction, location, operation, and maintenance of equipment for storage, handling, use, and transportation by tank truck or tank trailer of liquefied petroleum gases used for fuel purposes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

1 regulations for the design, construction, location, installation, operation, repair, and
2 maintenance of equipment for storage, handling, use, and transportation by tank
3 truck or tank trailer, of liquefied petroleum gases for fuel purposes, and for the
4 odorization of said gases used therewith, as shall render such equipment safe.

5 **SECTION 2.** 101.16 (2) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

6 101.16 (2) (b) 1. The department may not promulgate a rule that prohibits
7 self-service dispensing by the general public of liquefied petroleum gases for vehicle
8 fuel purposes.

9 2. The department may not promulgate a rule that requires completion of
10 training to dispense liquefied petroleum gases for vehicle fuel purposes.
