## **2023 SENATE BILL 926**

January 19, 2024 - Introduced by Senators Wanggaard and Taylor, cosponsored by Representatives Tusler and Stubbs. Referred to Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

#### \*\*\*AUTHORS SUBJECT TO CHANGE\*\*\*

AN ACT *to create* 946.645 of the statutes; **relating to:** picketing or parading at the residence of a judge with the intent to interfere with, obstruct, or impede the administration of justice or influence any judge and providing a penalty.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under this bill, it is a Class A misdemeanor to picket, parade, or demonstrate at or near any residence occupied by a judge with the intent to interfere with, obstruct, or impede the administration of justice or with the intent to influence any judge in the discharge of his or her duty. A Class A misdemeanor is punishable by a fine of up to \$10,000 or imprisonment not to exceed nine months, or both.

Because this bill creates a new crime or revises a penalty for an existing crime, the Joint Review Committee on Criminal Penalties may be requested to prepare a report.

- **SECTION 1.** 946.645 of the statutes is created to read:
- 946.645 Picketing or parading at the residence of a judge. Whoever
