2021 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 10

February 18, 2021 - Introduced by Senators Marklein and Ballweg, cosponsored by Representatives Plumer, Tranel, Allen, Armstrong, Baldeh, Dallman, Edming, Kerkman, Kitchens, Krug, Magnafici, Moses, Murphy, Novak, Skowronski, Spiros, Summerfield, Tauchen, Tittl and Tusler. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

T	Relating to: reaffirming Wisconsin's commitment to the strengthening and
2	deepening of the sister ties between the State of Wisconsin and Taiwan;
3	supporting Taiwan's signing of a Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) with the
4	United States; and continued support for increasing Taiwan's international
5	profile.
6	Whereas, the State of Wisconsin established in 1986 the sister-state
7	relationship with the Taiwan Province, Republic of China (Taiwan), and Wisconsin
8	and Taiwan have enjoyed strong bilateral trade, educational and cultural exchange,
9	and tourism; and
10	Whereas, Taiwan shares the same values of freedom, democracy, human rights,
11	the rule of law, peace, and prosperity with the United States and the State of
12	Wisconsin; and
13	Whereas, the United States ranks as Taiwan's second-largest trading partner,
14	Taiwan ranks as the tenth-largest trading partner of the United States, and
15	bilateral trade reached \$85.5 billion in 2019; and

Whereas, Taiwan and the State of Wisconsin have enjoyed a long and mutually beneficial relationship with the prospect of future growth, and Taiwan was Wisconsin's seventh-largest export market in Asia in 2019, with nearly \$225 million worth of Wisconsin goods exported to Taiwan; and

Whereas, negotiations for a Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) between Taiwan and the United States are an important step toward further strengthening bilateral trade between our countries, thereby increasing Wisconsin's exports to Taiwan and creating bilateral investment and technical collaboration through tariff reduction and other trade facilitation measures; and

Whereas, Taiwan has undertaken a policy of "steadfast diplomacy" in its international relations, and Taiwan is capable of fulfilling and willing to fulfill its responsibilities and collaborating with the world to deal with the challenges of humanitarian aid, disease control, and so forth; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the Wisconsin Legislature reaffirms its commitment to the strengthening and deepening of the sister ties between the State of Wisconsin and Taiwan; and, be it further

Resolved, That Wisconsin endorses Taiwan's efforts to secure the signing of a Bilateral Trade Agreement (BTA) with the United States and reiterates its support for a closer economic and trade partnership between the State of Wisconsin and Taiwan; and, be it further

Resolved, That Wisconsin continues to support Taiwan's appropriate participation in international organizations that impact the health, safety, and well-being of the people of Taiwan and supports Taiwan's aspiration to make more contributions in international societies; and, be it further
