2021 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 21

March 31, 2021 - Introduced by Senators Feyen, Bewley and Wanggaard, cosponsored by Representatives Skowronski, Horlacher, Sinicki, Vruwink and Wichgers. Referred to Committee on Senate Organization.

AUTHORS SUBJECT TO CHANGE

Relating to: honoring Wisconsinites who fought in the Polish January Insurrection

2	of 1863.
3	Whereas, over 150 years ago, while the United States was fighting its Civil War,
4	Poles who had lost their independence attempted to regain it by rising up against the
5	Russians occupying their lands; and
6	Whereas, beginning in 1863 and holding out for nearly a year and a half, the
7	participants of what historians refer to as the "January Insurrection" nobly fought
8	to restore their country's liberty; and
9	Whereas, the January Insurrection fell under the overwhelming force of the
10	Russian Army, but the Poles' noble efforts would lead to Poland regaining its
11	sovereignty a half-century later in 1918; and
12	Whereas, those who fought in the January Insurrection were forced to flee the
13	Russian Empire, and a significant number of these exiles found asylum here in the
14	United States; and

1	Whereas, these refugees created a new life in service of their adopted homeland,
2	a righteous tradition going back to when heroes such as Tadeusz Kosciuszko and
3	Kazimierz Pulaski fought in the American War for Independence; and
4	Whereas, the great state of Wisconsin was one of the places where the
5	participants of the January Insurrection settled; and
6	Whereas, these Polish settlers became an integral part of the social fabric of
7	Wisconsin, contributing greatly to its economic development; and
8	Whereas, in 2018, members of the Polish government visited Wisconsin and a
9	partnership between Wisconsin and Poland was formed; consisting of members of
10	the Wisconsin Legislature, the former governor of the Lublin Voivodeship, and
11	various businesses owners; and
12	Whereas, since the beginning of the partnership, members from both regions
13	have worked together to create a medical cooperation here in Wisconsin, as well as
14	new educational partnerships that will keep the history of Poland and Wisconsin
15	alive; now, therefore, be it
16	Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the members of the
17	Wisconsin Legislature join in honoring the memory of Wisconsinites who fought in
18	the Polish January Insurrection of 1863.
