1 **Relating to:** recognizing June 2021 as LGBTQ Pride Month.

2 Whereas, Wisconsin has a committed history of being at the forefront of
3 supporting equality for all its citizens; and

4 Whereas, in February 1982, Wisconsin made history when Governor Lee
5 Sherman Dreyfus signed the nation's first state law protecting lesbians and gays
6 from discrimination in employment, housing, and public accommodations; and

7 Whereas, in the intervening years, tremendous advancements have been made
8 with respect to equitable treatment of lesbians, gay men, bisexual, transgender, and
9 queer or questioning (LGBTQ) persons both in Wisconsin and throughout the nation;
10 and

11 Whereas, Wisconsin elected the first openly LGBTQ member of the U.S.
12 Senate, and the Wisconsin state legislature has six openly LGBTQ members; and

13 Whereas, in June 2014, same-sex couples were legally able to marry in
14 Wisconsin, and the U.S. Supreme Court affirmed the equal right to marriage for
15 same-sex couples in all 50 states in June 2015; and
