12    Bernard “Boob” Darling, LaVern “Lavvie” Dilweg, Francis “Jug” Earp, Robert “Cal”  
13    Hubbard, Earl “Curly” Lambeau, Verne Lewellen, John “Blood” McNally, and August  
14    “Mike” Michalske in 1970; and
