



## 2023 SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION 75

October 13, 2023 - Introduced by Senators FELZKOWSKI, CARPENTER, NASS, ROYS, SPREITZER, CABRAL-GUEVARA, BALLWEG, MARKLEIN, HESSELBEIN and COWLES, cosponsored by Representatives DUCHOW, MACCO, ARMSTRONG, BARE, DITTRICH, DONOVAN, DRAKE, EDMING, KITCHENS, KRUG, MAGNAFICI, NEDWESKI, O'CONNOR, OLDENBURG, PENTERMAN, RETTINGER, ROZAR, SCHUTT, SNYDER, SPIROS, STEFFEN, VINING, WITKE, STUBBS, S. 1     **Relating to:** proclaiming the month of October 2023 as Breast Cancer Awareness  
2         Month.

3         Whereas, the National Cancer Institute estimates that 297,790 women in the  
4     United States will be diagnosed with breast cancer in 2023, comprising over 15  
5     percent of all new cancer cases; and

6         Whereas, the National Cancer Institute estimates that 43,170 women in the  
7     United States will die from breast cancer in 2023, comprising over 7 percent of all  
8     cancer deaths; and

9         Whereas, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reported that 2,276  
10    men in the United States were diagnosed with breast cancer in 2017, while 510 men  
11    died from the disease; and

12         Whereas, the National Cancer Institute reported that the age-adjusted  
13    incidence rate for breast cancer between 2016 and 2020 for Wisconsin women was  
14    134.6 cases per 100,000 people each year, which was about 6 percent higher than the  
15    national incidence rate; and
