AN ACT to make appropriations for the fiscal biennium commencing July 1, 1 2 2020 and ending June 30, 2022; providing definitions; providing for 3 appropriations and transfers of funds for the period of the budget and for 4 the remainder of the current biennium as specified; providing for carryover 5 of certain funds beyond the biennium as specified; providing for employee positions as specified; providing for duties, terms and conditions and other б 7 requirements relating to appropriations for the remainder of the current biennium and the period of the budget as specified; providing for position 8 and other budgetary limitations; amending existing law by redirecting 9 revenues and making transfers for the period of the budget; providing for 10 reports related to appropriations; and providing for effective dates. 11

Expenditure of this appropriation is conditioned upon a match of funds in the ratio of one 8 dollar (\$1.00) of appropriated general funds to not less than one dollar 9 10 (\$1.00) of matching funds from a nonstate entity. This appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose. This appropriation 11 12 is effective immediately.

14 3. This general fund appropriation shall be reduced by an amount equal to 15 the total increased fee revenue collected and attributable to 2020 Senate 16 File 0060 if enacted into law as determined by the department of 17 environmental quality. A like amount of other funds (SR) are appropriated 18 to replace any reduction in the general fund appropriation associated with 19 this footnote.
