A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to school finance; eliminating the 2 moratorium imposed upon alternative schools included within 3 a district's configuration of schools under the block grant
- 4 funding model, subject to specified conditions; addressing
- 5 educational space for alternative schools as specified;
- 6 granting rulemaking authority; and providing for effective
- 7 dates.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-13-309(m)(v)(B) by creating a new
- 12 subparagraph (IV), as amended by 2013 Wyoming Session Laws,
- 13 Chapter 1, is amended to read:

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- 21-13-309. Determination of amount to be included in
- 16 foundation program for each district.

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2 (m) In determining the amount to be included in the 3 foundation program for each district, the director shall:

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5 (v) Based upon ADM computations and identified school configurations within each district pursuant to 6 7 paragraph (iv) of this subsection, compute the foundation program amount for each district as prescribed by the 8 9 education resource block grant model adopted by the Wyoming 10 legislature as defined under W.S. 21-13-101(a)(xiv), as contained within the spreadsheets and accompanying reports 11 12 referenced under W.S. 21-13-101(a) (xvii), on file with the 13 secretary of state and maintained by the director pursuant to W.S. 21-2-202(e). The following criteria shall be used 14 by the director in the administration of the education 15 resource block grant model: 16

Notwithstanding subparagraph 16 (m)(vi)(C) of this section, the school facilities 17 department shall not approve any district plan which includes educational space for the alternative school 18 within a separate facility unless the district provides 19 sufficient documentation and evidence that the school 20 21 cannot be collocated within a facility containing 22 educational space for another school with similar grade configurations operated by the district. 23

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3 (a) Section 1 of this act is effective immediately
4 upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become
5 a law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
6 Constitution, only if section 2 of this act is not
7 effective as provided by subsection (b) of this section.

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9 (b) If a final order by the district court of Laramie 10 County, Wyoming, is issued implementing without change the final ruling of the Wyoming Supreme Court issued January 11 12 28, 2014, in the case of Kerry and Clara Powers, on behalf 13 of themselves and the citizens of Wyoming, and Cindy Hill, 14 on behalf of herself and as the Superintendent of Public 15 Instruction v. State of Wyoming and Matthew H. Mead, Governor, in his official capacity [Docket No. S-13-0052], 16 17 then upon expiration of time for appeal of that order, or if appealed, upon issuance of a final order or mandate of 18 19 the Wyoming Supreme Court confirming the district court 20 final order, the Governor shall certify the entry of the 21 district court final order. The Governor shall immediately

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1 file any certification under this section together with the

2 final order with the secretary of state. If the

3 certification is filed with the secretary of state after

4 the effective date of this act, section 2 of this act is

5 effective upon filing and shall supersede section 1 of this

6 act.
