Definitions. 11 12 (a) As used in this act: 13 14 (xxv) "License", "driver's license", "digital 15 driver's license", "commercial driver's 16 license", 17 "instruction permit", "commercial learner's permit" or "intermediate permit" means a license or permit secured by a 18 19 person from the division, in accordance with this act which

grants the privilege to drive or operate a motor vehicle on

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the public highways, streets and roads of this state;

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1 (xlix) "Digital driver's license" means a secure 2 electronic representation of a physical driver's license that 3 is stored on the driver's portable electronic device and may 4 be viewed or verified by a person to whom access is allowed. 5 A digital driver's license may be used in lieu of a physical 6 driver's license and is optional to purchase and supplemental 7 to a physical driver's license; 8 9 (1) "Last known address" means the address, email 10 address or other electronic contact information, as applicable, according to the sending method, on file with the 11 12 division; 13 (li) "Portable electronic device" means an 14 electronic device that is portable in nature, is easily 15 16 carried or conveyed by hand and may be used to display, 17 transmit, or both; 18 19 (lii) "REAL ID Act" means the REAL ID Act of 2005, 20 Public Law 109-13, 119 Stat. 302, enacted May 11, 2005, and

Administration and enforcement. 5 The administration of this act shall be exercised 6 by the department, which may prescribe forms and reasonable 7 8 rules and regulations in conformity with this act and the <u>Uniform Electronic Transactions Act under W.S. 40-21-101</u> 9 10 through 40-21-119. Provisions of this act prevail over the 11 <u>Uniform Electronic Transactions Act if there is a conflict.</u> 12 The department shall keep records of all monies received and 13 disbursed. The records shall be open to examination by the 14 director of the state department of audit or his designee and the legislative service office. The highway patrol and all 15 16 peace officers of any county or municipality shall aid in the 17 enforcement of this act. 18 19 31-7-106. License required; limited to one license. 20 21 No person shall have more than one (1) valid license or any other state-issued, REAL ID 22 driver's 23 Act-compliant identification card at any time. 19	31-7-115. Issuance, description and contents.
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21	(c) Any permit issued in connection with a commercial
22	learner's permit shall be issued on as a separate document or
23	digital document, which shall comply with all security

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measures required by the department to comply with applicable 1 2 federal law. 3 4 (d) A license issued under subsection (a) of this section may include a digital driver's license. A digital 5 driver's license may be issued upon request of a licensee and 6 payment of the required fee. No digital driver's license shall 7 8 be issued unless the applicant holds the corresponding physical driver's license or unless the corresponding 9 10 physical driver's license is issued simultaneously. The 11 department may digitally cancel, suspend or revalidate a 12 digital driver's license on the occasions that a physical driver's license would be taken possession of, cancelled, 13 suspended, returned or reinstated, as appropriate. A digital 14 driver's license shall be designed: 15 16 17 (i) To protect to the maximum extent practicable the digital driver's license holder's privacy, including the 18 19 use of privacy enhancing technologies or other security 20 methods as deemed appropriate by the department; 21 (ii) So that there is no need for the driver's 22 license holder to relinquish possession of the portable 23

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4 31-7-116. Carrying and displaying.

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Every licensee shall have his driver's license in his 6 immediate possession at all times when driving a motor vehicle 7 8 and shall display the license upon demand of any judicial 9 officer, municipal court judge, any officer or agent of the 10 division or any police officer as defined in W.S. 11 31-5-102(a)(xxxiii). However, no person charged with 12 violating this section shall be convicted if he produces in 13 court a driver's license previously issued to him and valid at the time of his arrest. For the purposes of this section 14 "display" of a physical license means the surrender of his 15 16 the physical license to the demanding officer. After 17 examination the officer shall immediately return the license to the licensee except as provided in W.S. 31-5-1205(k). For 18 purposes of this section "display" of a digital driver's 19 20 license means that a licensee may provide access to the digital driver's license on the licensee's portable 21 electronic device. No law enforcement or judicial officer 22 demanding display of a licensee's digital driver's license 23

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- 9 (a) Upon cancelling, suspending or revoking a license,
- 10 the division shall require that the any physical license be
- 11 surrendered to the division and that any digital driver's
- 12 license be cancelled or suspended.

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- 14 (b) Any person whose license has been cancelled,
- 15 suspended or revoked shall immediately return his physical
- 16 license to the division.

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- 18 (c) At the end of a period of a suspension, the division
- 19 shall return a license to the licensee, if unexpired, and
- 20 <u>revalidate any digital driver's license, if applicable</u>.

- 22 31-7-137. Proof of receipt of notice or order; change
- 23 of address or name.

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2 (a) Evidence that a notice or order from the division 3 under this act was mailed to the last known address of a 4 person is prima facie proof the person received the notice or 5 order five (5) days after the notice or order was mailed. As used in this section, "last known address" means the address 6 on file with the division. Evidence that a notice or order 7 8 from the division was sent by electronic means to the person's 9 <u>last known address</u>, if the person has consented to receive 10 notices electronically, is prima facie proof that the person received the notice or order one (1) day after the notice or 11 12 order was sent electronically.

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14 (b) A person licensed under this act shall notify the division in writing within ten (10) days of any change of his 15 16 address or name. Notification to the division may be by electronic means if the division has made electronic 17 notification available and if the person opts to use 18 19 electronic means. The division shall maintain a record of 20 the names and addresses of all persons licensed under this 21 act and shall amend the record when notified under this subsection. 22

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31-8-101. Issuance to residents by department;
restrictions; limited to one state-issued credential; digital
identification card; definitions; rulemaking.

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5 Wyoming resident may issued Any be an identification card by the department of transportation if 6 7 the resident does not possess or surrenders any other 8 state-issued, REAL ID Act or other applicable federal law compliant driver's license or identification card. The 9 10 application shall state the registrant's full legal name, 11 social security number, date of birth and any other 12 identifying data the department may require and shall be signed and verified by the applicant. The identification 13 card shall at the applicant's request indicate that the 14 15 applicant is an anatomical organ donor as provided by W.S. 16 35-5-205 or that the applicant has a medical alert designation 17 as provided for in W.S. 31-7-142. Before receiving an identification card under this chapter a person who 18 previously has been licensed or issued an identification card 19 20 in this or any other state but who does not have the 21 credential in their possession shall complete an affidavit of "No License/ID Card in Possession." 22

1	(c) An identification card issued under subsection (a)
2	of this section may include a digital identification card. A
3	digital identification card may be issued upon request of a
4	registrant and payment of the required fee. No digital
5	identification card shall be issued unless the applicant
6	holds the corresponding physical identification card or
7	unless the corresponding physical identification card is
8	issued simultaneously. A registrant may display a digital
9	identification card by providing access to the digital
10	identification card on the registrant's portable electronic
11	device. No law enforcement or judicial officer demanding
12	display of a registrant's digital identification card for any
13	identification verification purpose shall take custody of the
14	registrant's portable electronic device. Display of a digital
15	identification card shall not serve as consent to search the
16	registrant's portable electronic device. A digital
17	identification card shall be designed in accordance with
18	W.S. 31-7-115(d)(i) and (ii).

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23 31-8-103. Expiration; records; new cards.

2 (d) The division shall send an application a 3 notification for an identification card to the last known 4 address of every eligible registrant, or notify by electronic 5 means if the eligible registrant has consented to receive 6 notices electronically, within one hundred twenty (120) days prior to expiration of the registrant's identification card. 7 8 Every identification card is renewable upon application and 9 payment of the required fee. As used in this section, "last 10 known address" means the address, email address or other 11 electronic contact information, as applicable according to 12 the sending method, on file with the division.

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14 **31-8-104.** Fees.

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16 Every applicant for an identification card shall pay ten dollars (\$10.00) to the department plus an additional ten 17 dollars (\$10.00) for a digital identification card if 18 19 applicable. The state treasurer shall credit identification 20 card fees to the highway fund. Identification cards, 21 including digital identification cards, issued as a result of the cancellation of a license under W.S. 31-7-122(a)(i) shall 22 23 be issued without payment of any fee.

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2	31-8-105. Prohibited acts; penalties.
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4	(a) No person shall:
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6	(iv) Photograph, photostat, duplicate or in any
7	way reproduce any identification card or facsimile thereof in
8	such a manner that it could be mistaken for a valid
9	identification card. Possession and display of a digital
10	identification card shall not be considered a violation of
