A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to solid waste disposal districts;
 2 repealing limitation on reappointment of board members; and
 3 providing for an effective date.

5 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 18-11-102(a) is amended to read:

9 **18-11-102. Powers; management; rates; penalty for**
 10 **violation of rules.**

12 (a) Following the creation of a solid waste disposal
 13 district the board of county commissioners shall appoint
 14 not less than three (3) nor more than nine (9) residents of
 15 the district to constitute the governing board of the
 16 district. Appointees shall serve a term of three (3) years
 17 and may be reappointed. ~~for three (3) additional terms.~~

1 Terms of office shall be staggered. The governing board may
2 exercise all powers granted to cities and towns by W.S.
3 15-1-103(a)(xxi) and (xl) and shall adopt rules and
4 regulations in managing the disposal of solid wastes within
5 the district. Violation of a rule or regulation of the
6 governing board requiring disposal of solid wastes in
7 designated sites constitutes a misdemeanor punishable upon
8 conviction by a fine not to exceed seven hundred fifty
9 dollars (\$750.00) or imprisonment not exceeding six (6)
10 months or both. A governing board may also enforce its
11 rules and regulations by appropriate legal proceedings and
12 expend and generate revenue relative to the purpose of a
13 solid waste disposal district. The governing board may
14 permit persons or entities not included within the district
15 to utilize the facilities of the district. The governing
16 board may impose fees upon persons or entities included
17 within or outside of the district for the privilege of
18 utilizing the facilities of the district at rates
19 established by the governing board and any revenue
20 generated in this manner shall only be used to operate the
21 district.

1 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2013.
