- 15 participants for which coverage has been elected under W.S.

1	27-14-108(m), all persons receiving training under any work
2	or job training program for which coverage has been elected
3	under W.S. 27-14-108(p), all volunteers covered under this
4	act, mine rescue team members, recipients of any welfare
5	program performing work for a governmental entity, federal
6	programs which require coverage for their participants,
7	prisoners and probationers under W.S. 27-14-108(d)(ix) and
8	persons performing community service pursuant to a criminal
9	sentencing order, or a diversion agreement entered into
10	with a prosecuting authority, under W.S. $27-14-108(d)(xv)$,
11	are deemed to be paid for each month of active service, an
12	amount established by rule and regulation of the division
13	based upon the cost of the specific employment category to
14	the worker's compensation account. This amount shall be
15	established solely as a basis for determining employer
16	contributions and is not binding upon any employer as an
17	actual required salary for any volunteer or other
18	individual enumerated under this subsection. The division
19	shall report any anticipated deficiencies in contributions
20	due to this subsection to the legislature on or before
21	January 15 of each year.

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23 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-2-2608(d) is repealed.

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Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

Constitution.
