## HOUSE BILL NO. HB0010

Education-state authorization reciprocity agreement.

Sponsored by: Joint Education Interim Committee

## A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to post secondary education; authorizing 1 the Wyoming Community College Commission to enter into and 2 administer reciprocity agreements with other states on the 3 4 licensing of specified post secondary institutions; authorizing admission of post secondary institutions with a 5 physical presence in Wyoming under reciprocity agreement 6 and providing for reciprocal licensure in Wyoming of 7 8 institutions located in states that are signatories to the 9 agreement; granting rulemaking authority and authorizing fees; providing an appropriation; and providing for an 10 effective date. 11

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13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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15 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-18-226 is created to read:

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1 21-18-226. State authorization reciprocity

2 agreements; administration; requirements; fees; rules and

3 regulations.

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5 (a) The commission shall enter into an agreement with

6 the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education to

7 participate, on behalf of the state of Wyoming, with all

8 other states legally joining in the state authorization

9 reciprocity agreement.

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11 (b) The requirements of the agreement shall be

12 sufficient to protect the integrity of Wyoming post

13 secondary education, but shall also allow authorized

14 institutions complying with the agreement the ability to

15 reach as many potential students as possible.

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17 (c) The commission shall review applications from any

18 public or private post secondary institution seeking

19 admission under the state reciprocity agreement if the

20 institution has a physical presence in Wyoming and is

21 organized under the laws of the state of Wyoming. The

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22 commission shall:

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1 (i) Admit to the state authorization agreement 2 any qualified public or private applicant that meets the 3 requirements of the state authorization reciprocity 4 agreement pertaining to institutional quality, consumer 5 protection and fiscal viability as defined by subsection (d) of this section; 6 7 8 (ii) Monitor compliance of admitted institutions for institutional quality, consumer protection and fiscal 9 10 viability; 11 12 (iii) Notify, in a timely manner, the Western 13 Interstate Commission for Higher Education of those post 14 secondary institutions admitted to the reciprocity agreement under paragraph (i) of this subsection and any 15 16 action taken against an authorized institution pursuant to paragraph (iv) of this subsection; and 17 18 19 Take appropriate action (iv) against any 20 authorized institution upon failure to comply with 21 requirements of the state authorization reciprocity 22 agreement, including an investigation, citation, suspension

or expulsion from the reciprocity agreement.

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1 2 (d) For purposes of paragraph (c)(i) of this section, 3 an institution may satisfy: 4 (i) The institutional quality standard through 5 evidence of current accreditation; 6 7 8 (ii) The consumer protection standard through 9 evidence that information required under Title IV of the 10 Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. § 1070 et seq.), as 11 amended, is provided to current and prospective students, 12 and evidence of a procedure for addressing student 13 complaints both internally and through an outside state 14 agency as required by that act; 15 16 (iii) The fiscal viability standard for public institutions through evidence of adequate public funding, 17 18 or for a private institution, through evidence that the 19 United States department of education, in its most recent 20 fiscal year report, assigned the institution a financial 21 responsibility composite score of one and five-tenths (1.5)

or greater, or a financial responsibility composite score

1 of not less than one (1) if the report covers the most

2 recent two (2) consecutive fiscal years.

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4 (e) The commission may adopt rules and regulations to

5 implement this section.

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7 (f) For purposes of administrating this section, the

8 commission may establish and collect fees from authorized

9 institutions to pay necessary administrative expenses

10 incurred under this section. Any fees collected pursuant

11 to this subsection shall be deposited into the general

12 fund.

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14 (g) As used in this section:

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16 (i) "Accredited" or "accreditation" means the

17 status of public recognition that an accrediting agency

18 recognized by the United States department of education

19 pursuant to Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965

20 (20 U.S.C. § 1070 et seq.), as amended, grants to an

21 institution or educational program that meets the

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22 department's established requirements;

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Τ	(11) "Educational program" means a program of
2	organized instruction or study beyond secondary education
3	that leads to an academic professional degree, vocational
4	degree or certificate or other recognized educational
5	credential;
6	
7	(iii) "Physical presence" means the ongoing
8	occupation of a physical location in Wyoming for
9	instructional purposes or the maintenance of an
10	administrative office in Wyoming to facilitate instruction.
11	For purposes of this section, the following activities do
12	not constitute a physical presence in Wyoming:
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14	(A) Delivery of distance education courses
15	online;
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17	(B) Advertising;
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19	(C) Recruiting;

21	(D) Courses delivered on military
22	installations by an accredited institution limited to
23	active and reserve military personnel, dependents of

1 military personnel and civilian employees of the military

2 installation;

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4 (E) Operation of a server or other

5 electronic service device; or

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7 (F) Experiential learning opportunities

8 such as a clinical practicum residency or internship.

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10 (iv) "Post secondary institution" means a

11 person, business entity, nonprofit corporation or

12 governmental entity that operates educational programs

13 beyond secondary education;

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15 (v) "State authorization reciprocity agreement"

16 means an agreement, as published by the Western Interstate

17 Commission for Higher Education on November 1, 2013, or

18 substantially similar to the version published on that

19 date, which allows post secondary institutions that meet

20 federal criteria to recruit, advertise, market and conduct

21 distance education across state lines with as few

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22 restrictions as possible.

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9 Section 3. For the period commencing on the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2016, up to thirty 10 thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) is appropriated from the 11 12 general fund to the Wyoming community college commission for purposes of administering this act. The commission 13 shall include this appropriation as part of its standard 14 budget request commencing fiscal years 2016-2017 and 2017-15

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2018.

Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon 18 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 19 20 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 21 Constitution.
