## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; creating crimes

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-3-205 and 6-3-308 are created to
- 9 read:

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11 6-3-205. Impeding critical infrastructure.

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- 13 (a) A person is guilty of impeding critical
- 14 infrastructure if he intentionally or knowingly impedes the

1 operations of a critical infrastructure facility in a manner

2 not otherwise authorized by law.

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4 (b) Impeding critical infrastructure is:

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6 (i) A misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for

7 not more than six (6) months, a fine of not more than one

8 thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or both, if the impediment

9 causes damage or economic loss, the cost of which is less

than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00);

12 (ii) A felony punishable by imprisonment for not

13 more than ten (10) years, a fine of not more than ten thousand

14 dollars (\$10,000.00), or both, if the impediment causes

15 damage or economic loss, the cost of which is one thousand

16 dollars (\$1,000.00) or more.

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18 (c) If a series of damage or loss results from a single

19 continuing course of conduct, a single violation of this

20 section may be charged and penalties imposed based on the

21 aggregate cost of the damage or loss.

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1 organization that aids, abets, solicits, (d) An 2 compensates, hires, conspires with, commands or procures a 3 commit the crime of impeding person to 4 infrastructure is subject to a fine not to exceed one hundred 5 thousand dollars (\$100,000.00), provided that the organization acted with the intent that the crime of impeding 6 critical infrastructure be completed. A 7 critical 8 infrastructure facility may maintain a civil action against 9 an organization for damages suffered as a consequence of a 10 violation of this subsection, including damages for lost profits, whether or not any fine is imposed pursuant to this 11

(e) Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply
to public demonstrations or other expressions of free speech
or free association to the extent that such activity is
protected under the United States or Wyoming constitutions.

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19 (f) No person shall be liable for a violation of 20 subsection (a) or (b) of this section if the person:

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(i) Owns or legally occupies the land upon which
the critical infrastructure facility is located and is

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1 engaged in conduct not inconsistent with the operation of the 2 critical infrastructure facility or that is authorized by an 3 agreement; 4 (ii) Is lawfully engaged in any regulatory or 5 legal process to which the critical infrastructure facility 6 7 is subject; 8 9 (iii) Is engaged in conduct arising out of a bona fide dispute about access to land. 10 11 12 (q) As used in this section: 13 14 "Economic loss" means a monetary loss that (i) occurs as a result of the commission of the crime under 15 subsection (a) of this section, including lost profit and the 16 17 cost to restore the operational capacity lost as a result of the crime; 18 19 20 (ii) "Impedes" means: 21 22 To block the operation of or prevent (A)

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12 (a) A person is guilty of critical infrastructure

13 trespass if he enters or remains on or in a critical

14 infrastructure facility or the construction site of a

15 permitted critical infrastructure facility knowing he is not

16 authorized to do so or after being notified to depart or to

17 not trespass. For purposes of this section, notice is given

18 by:

20 (i) Personal communication to the person by the

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21 owner or occupant, or his agent, or by a peace officer;

1 (ii) Posting of signs reasonably likely to come to 2 the attention of intruders; or 3 4 (iii) The presence of fencing or other physical barrier designed to exclude intruders. 5 6 7 (b) Critical infrastructure trespass is a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, a 8 fine of not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or 9 10 both. 11 12 (c) No person shall be liable for a violation of subsection (a) of this section if that person: 13 14 15 (i) Owns or legally occupies the land upon which 16 the facility is located and is engaged in conduct not 17 inconsistent with the operation of the critical infrastructure facility or that is authorized by 18 19 agreement; 20 21 (ii) Is lawfully engaged in any regulatory or legal process to which the critical infrastructure facility 22 is subject. 23

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8	(a) As used in this act, unless otherwise defined:
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10	(xvii) "Critical infrastructure facility" means:
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12	(A) Any portion of an oil, gas, hazardous
13	liquid or chemical pipeline, or tank, that is buried, enclosed
14	by a fence, enclosed by a physical barrier or is clearly
15	marked with signs prohibiting trespassing, that are obviously
16	designed to exclude intruders; or

18	(B) One (1) of the following, if completely
19	enclosed by a fence or other physical barrier that is
20	obviously designed to exclude intruders, or if clearly marked
21	with a sign or signs that are reasonably likely to come to
22	the attention of intruders and indicate that entry is
23	forbidden without authorization:

metering stations, piping, a regulator station or a natural
gas storage facility;
(X) A crude oil or refined products
storage and distribution facility, including storage tanks,
valve sites, pipeline interconnections, pump stations,
metering stations, pipelines or piping and truck loading or
offloading facilities;
(XI) An aboveground or underground
mining facility;
(XII) An electrical power generating
facility, substation, switching station, electrical control
center or electric power lines and associated equipment

5	center that has an average constant draw of at least one (1)

15	multiple users or an irrigation district;

18	treatment facility, wastewater treatment plant or pump
19	station.

22	or (B) of this paragraph that is lawfully permitted and under
23	construction.
