- 1 AN ACT relating to electrical safety; repealing waiver of
- 2 licensing requirement for installation of low voltage cable
- 3 services; providing waiver of master or journeyman
- 4 licensing requirement for installation, repair or
- 5 maintenance of certain lawn sprinkler control systems by
- 6 persons who obtain a limited electrical contractor's
- 7 license; providing for rulemaking to establish certain
- 8 minimum standards; and providing for an effective date.

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 12 **Section 1.** W.S. 35-9-123(a)(intro) and (viii) by
- 13 creating a new subparagraph (F), 35-9-124(a)(i) and
- 14 35-9-126(a) are amended to read:

1 35-9-123. Electrical installations to be performed by
2 licensed electricians; exceptions.

electrical contractors 4 (a) Licensed employing 5 licensed master or journeymen electricians, or registered apprentice electricians supervised by a licensed master or 6 electrician shall install all electrical 7 journeyman equipment. This requirement is waived for the following, 8 9 however the waiver does not exempt the following persons

from meeting all other code requirements under this act:

Licensed limited electrical contractors (viii) 12 13 employing licensed limited technicians or registered limited apprentice technicians who may install electrical 14 equipment which falls under the scope of their limited 15 The electrical work shall only license or registration. 16 17 include the electrical system on the load side of the disconnect which supplies power to the electrical equipment 18 that they are licensed to work on. The chief electrical 19 20 inspector may issue a limited electrical contractor's 21 license to a contractor not qualified for an electrical 22 contractor's license but qualified in his limited area of expertise for the: 23

5 (a) Applicants for master electrician, journeymen electrician, low voltage technician and limited technician 6 licenses shall apply to the chief electrical inspector on a 7 form furnished by the board and accompanied by the required 8 9 examination fee. The form shall state the applicant's full name, his address, the extent of his experience and other 10 11 information required by the board. An applicant who complies with the rules of the board, 12 is qualified, 13 successfully completes the examination and pays the 14 required license fee shall be issued the proper license by the chief electrical inspector which bears the date of 15 issue. A master license shall expire on July 1 in the 16 17 third year following the year of issue. A journeyman license shall expire on January 1 in the third year 18 following the year of issue. A low voltage technician 19 20 license shall expire on July 1 in the third year following 21 the year of issue. A limited technician license shall 22 expire on July 1 in the third year following the year of issue. Credit for time spent in any electrical school 23 24 shall be given to master electricians, journeyman

2	technicians for time spent in classes up to a total of two
3	(2) years, or four thousand (4,000) hours, on the work
4	experience requirements The department shall give credit
5	for up to a total of two (2) years or four thousand (4,000)

7	classes in any electrical school to master electricians,
8	journeyman electricians, low voltage technicians, and
9	limited technicians.
