Contagious and infectious diseases among livestock.

Sponsored by: Joint Agriculture, State and Public Lands and Water Resources Interim Committee

## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to contagious and infectious diseases among
- 2 livestock; revising provisions related to contagious and
- 3 infectious diseases among livestock and other animals as
- 4 specified; increasing certain penalties related to diseases
- 5 among livestock and other animals as specified; repealing
- 6 obsolete provisions; and providing for an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-1-103, 11-19-103(a) and (e),
- 11 11-19-104(a)(intro), 11-19-108, 11-19-111(a), (b) and (d),
- 12 11-19-112, 11-19-201(a)(i), by creating a new paragraph
- 13 (ii) and by renumbering (ii) as (iii), 11-19-205,
- 14 11-19-208, 11-19-209, 11-19-210, 11-19-214, 11-19-215,
- 15 11-19-303, 11-19-304, 11-19-306, 11-19-401, 11-19-402 and
- 16 11-19-403 are amended to read:

2 11-1-103. Penalty for violations.

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- 4 A person who violates any of the following sections commits
- 5 a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than
- 6 six (6) months, a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty
- 7 dollars (\$750.00), or both for the first offense, or by
- 8 imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, a fine of not
- 9 more than one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00), or
- 10 both for second or subsequent offenses: W.S. 11-6-210(a) or
- 11 (f), 11-18-112, 11-19-101, 11-19-102, 11-19-103, 11-19-111,
- 12 11-19-210, 11-19-215, 11-19-304, 11-19-306, 11-19-401,
- 13 11-20-114, 11-20-117, 11-20-229, 11-20-230, 11-21-104,
- 14 11-22-118, 11-23-106, 11-23-207, 11-24-106, 11-30-114 and
- 15 11-48-102. A person who violates board rules promulgated
- 16 pursuant to W.S. 11-18-103(a)(v) shall be subject to the
- 17 penalties specified in this section.

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- 19 11-19-103. Quarantine of diseased animals generally;
- 20 treatment, testing and vaccination thereof; effect of
- 21 failure to obey order of state veterinarian; appeal; stay

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22 of action.

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1 In all cases of infectious and contagious disease animals in this state, 2 domestic the state veterinarian may order the quarantine of the infected 3 premises. If the disease becomes epidemic epizootic in any 4 5 locality in this state, the state veterinarian shall immediately notify the governor shall 6 who issue his proclamation forbidding transfer of any animal of the kind 7 among which the epidemic epizootic disease exists from the 8 9 locality without permission from the state veterinarian.

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11 (e) If the owner or persons in charge of animals ordered treated, tested, vaccinated or quarantined after 12 13 reasonable notice determined by the veterinarian, fail to 14 treat, test, vaccinate or quarantine such animals ordered, the veterinarian may seize or cause such animals 15 to be seized and treated, tested, vaccinated or guarantined 16 17 and may hold and sell the animals, or part thereof as necessary to pay all costs of inspection, seizing, caring 18 for, treating, testing, vaccinating or quarantine together 19 with cost of sale. The sale shall be made at the time and 20 21 place and in the manner prescribed by the veterinarian. Not 22 less than three (3) days nor more than fifteen (15) days notice of the time, place and purpose of the sale shall be 23 24 given by the veterinarian to the owner or persons in charge

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1 of the animals, by personal service within the county in

2 which the animals are being held if possible, and if not

3 possible then such notice may be given either by personal

4 service outside of the county or by advertisement in any

5 paper selected by the veterinarian. The state veterinarian

6 shall only sell the <del>livestock animals</del> after all other

7 remedies have been exhausted.

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9 11-19-104. Slaughter of diseased animals; authority

10 of veterinarian; slaughtering order; when consent of owner

11 required.

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13 (a) In any case of epidemic epizootic disease where

14 premises have been previously quarantined by the state

15 veterinarian, he may order the slaughter of any diseased

16 animals upon the premises and all animals that have been

17 exposed to contagion or infection under the following

18 restrictions:

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20 11-19-108. Compensation of board.

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22 Each member of a board of arbitration shall receive five

23 dollars (\$5.00) one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each day

24 actually engaged and employed in the investigation of any

1 claim, paid by the state veterinarian out of an

2 appropriation for that purpose.

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4 11-19-111. Regulation of importation of animals;

5 prohibited acts; penalties; applicability.

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(a) The governor, upon recommendation of the Wyoming 7 may regulate by proclamation 8 livestock board, 9 importation into Wyoming from any other state 10 livestock, or any virulent blood or live virus of animal, 11 blood, microorganism or biologic agent capable of causing any disease affecting livestock or other animals, or any 12 13 thing other item suspected of being infected or contaminated with livestock disease germs biologic agents 14 capable of causing animal disease, except under such 15 conditions as he deems proper for the protection of the 16 17 livestock, livestock animals as defined in W.S. 11-29-101(a) (vi) and other domestic animals of Wyoming. All 18 requirements in the governor's proclamation shall be 19 enforced by the Wyoming livestock board. 20

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22 (b) After a proclamation is issued by the governor it 23 is unlawful for any person to import into Wyoming or 24 receive imports within this state from any other state any

livestock, virulent blood or live virus of animal, blood, 1 microorganism or biologic agent capable of causing any 2 diseases affecting livestock or other animals, or 3 product or thing item suspected of being infected or 4 5 contaminated with livestock disease germs biologic agents capable of causing animal disease, except under 6 such conditions as may be imposed by the proclamation. Any 7 person who violates this section shall be punished as 8 9 provided in W.S. 11-1-103. The violator is civilly liable 10 for all damages and loss sustained by any person by reason 11 of violation of the proclamation.

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13 (d) The state veterinarian may inspect, treat, test,
14 vaccinate, quarantine or sell any livestock or other
15 domestic animals imported into Wyoming in violation of W.S.
16 11-19-111 or any rules promulgated thereunder. Any order
17 or regulation made by the state veterinarian is subject to
18 review, modification or annulment by the governor or the
19 board at any subsequent meeting.

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21 11-19-112. Cooperation with animal and plant health 22 inspection service.

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The state consents to having the bureau of animal industry
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    animal and plant health inspection service of the United
    States department of agriculture and its employees come

    within Wyoming for all purposes connected with the
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    importation and exportation of diseased livestock and for
    all purposes connected with the eradication, suppression
6
    and control of dangerously infectious and contagious

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11-19-205. State veterinarian may require annual 1 2 test. 3 4 The mayor or governing body of any city or town state 5 veterinarian may require by ordinance persons selling or offering for sale any milk or milk products within the city 6 or town state to have all livestock animals producing the 7 milk tested for tuberculosis at least once each year, and 8 9 may prohibit the sale use of milk or milk products in the 10 city or town state from these livestock animals unless all cows livestock animals from which such milk is produced 11 have passed the test required tests for tuberculosis within 12 13 the past year. 14 11-19-208. Ear tags; record to be kept of livestock 15 animals tested. 16 17 livestock animal which passes the tested for 18 19 tuberculosis test satisfactorily shall have an official ear tag inserted in its ear. The state testing veterinarian 20 21 shall see that a correct record is kept of all cattle 22 tested, the date and place of testing, the names and addresses of owners and the number of the ear tag inserted 23

in the ear of each animal, and shall report this

1 information in his regular biennial report keep an official record of all livestock animals tested and submit a copy of 2 3 the record to state and federal animal health officials. 4 5 11-19-209. Tests of livestock animals. 6 Whenever the state veterinarian suspects that tuberculosis 7 exists or has been introduced by imported dairy cattle 8 9 among any dairy cattle in this state to livestock animals, he shall order the retesting testing of same, regardless of 10 11 any former tests made the livestock animals. 12 13 11-19-210. Veterinarian's certificate special or permit; required to sell milk or cream; penalty for failure 14 15 to comply. 16 17 The state veterinarian may require a certificate or special

The state veterinarian may require a certificate or special
permit for a person selling milk or cream when he has
reason to believe an animal or public health risk exists.

The certificate or special permit required under this
section shall identify the results of specific diagnostic
tests or other measures required to be completed prior to
the use of milk or cream for human consumption. No person
selling milk or cream in cities or towns or to creameries

in this state, may sell such milk or cream unless they
possess a certificate or special permit from required by
the state veterinarian under this section. Any person
violating this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall
be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than

6 one hundred dollars (\$100.00) punished as provided in W.S.

7 11-1-103 for each offense.

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## 9 11-19-214. Disposition of diseased livestock.

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All livestock animals in Wyoming lawfully found to be 11 affected with or exposed to tuberculosis may be shipped 12 13 disposed on the origin premises or transported under the 14 direction of the state veterinarian in accordance with federal regulations, to livestock markets and there sold 15 for salvage and destroyed or transferred directly to an 16 17 approved slaughter facility, rendering facility veterinary diagnostic laboratory in accordance with federal 18 regulations. Producers may be eligible for indemnification 19 as provided in W.S. 11-19-106 for any livestock animal 20 21 ordered disposed pursuant to this section.

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## 23 11-19-215. Prohibited acts; penalties.

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Any person who intentionally interferes with, refuses to 1 assist in gathering and testing his cattle livestock 2 animals, or hinders the work of the state veterinarian or 3 his employees under this act, or who attempts to defeat the 4 5 object of the tuberculin test by a previous injection of tuberculin commonly known as "plugging," or in any way 6 attempts to prevent an accurate and truthful determination 7 of the condition of the cattle livestock animals tested, 8 9 shall be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more 10 than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or imprisoned not more 11 than thirty (30) days, or both punished as provided in W.S. 12 11-1-103.

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14 11-19-303. Appropriations by counties for control of diseases.

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17 The board of county commissioners may appropriate as much money as it deems necessary for the control and eradication 18 of any infectious, contagious or communicable diseases of 19 20 livestock. The funds shall be used in cooperation with the 21 state veterinarian or the veterinary services, United 22 States department of agriculture, animal and plant health inspection service in testing animals and disposing of 23 24 diseased animals disclosed by the tests as provided by law.

2 11-19-304. Prohibition on importation of cattle or 3 bison; penalties.

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- 5 Any person bringing cattle or bison into any "tuberculosis
- 6 modified accredited area tuberculosis accredited-free area
- 7 except in compliance with the rules and regulations made by
- 8 the state veterinarian shall upon conviction be punished by
- 9 imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, or by a fine
- 10 of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or both as
- 11 provided in W.S. 11-1-103.

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- 13 11-19-306. Penalties for violation of rules and
- 14 regulations.

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- 16 Any person who violates any lawful rule or regulation made
- 17 by the state veterinarian pursuant to W.S. 11-19-305 is
- 18 quilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction, shall be
- 19 punished by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, or
- 20 by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00),
- 21 or both as provided in W.S. 11-1-103.

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- 23 11-19-401. Tagging, branding and disposition of
- 24 cattle reacting to test; penalties for failure to comply.

2	All cattle in Wyoming reacting to an agglutination a
3	<pre>confirmatory test for brucellosis (Bang's disease) except</pre>
4	reactors under thirty (30) months of age which have been
5	officially vaccinated with brucella abortus vaccine, strain
6	19, and except officially vaccinated adult animals which
7	were negative to the agglutination test for brucellosis
8	within ten (10) days prior to vaccination, must shall be
9	immediately tagged in the left ear with a Bang's reactor
10	tag and permanently branded with a hot iron letter "B" on
11	the left jaw by or in the presence of an officially
12	authorized veterinarian. All such reactors <u>must_shall</u> be
13	disposed of for slaughter or diagnostic purposes only, upon
14	and according to written instruction from the Wyoming
15	livestock board. Any person who violates any provision of
16	this section shall be punished as provided in W.S.
17	11-1-103. As used in this section, "confirmatory test"
18	means a test for brucellosis that has the specificity and
19	sensitivity to verify the presence or absence of brucella
20	abortus in animal serum or tissues and is used to confirm
21	results from an initial brucellosis test.

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1 11-19-402. Breeding cattle and bison entering state

2 to show evidence of negative test or vaccination for

3 brucellosis; exceptions.

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5 All breeding cattle and buffalo bison entering Wyoming

6 shall be accompanied by a proper health certificate showing

7 evidence of a negative blood test for brucellosis made

8 within thirty (30) days prior to entry, or evidence of

9 being officially vaccinated by a licensed veterinarian

10 during calfhood against brucellosis. Breeding cattle and

11 buffalo bison originating from modified certified

12 brucellosis areas, certified brucellosis free areas and

13 from certified brucellosis free herds entering Wyoming may

14 be exempt from this section but must be accompanied by a

15 proper health certificate.

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17 11-19-403. When cattle or bison exempt from

18 provisions.

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20 Breeding cattle and buffalo bison entering Wyoming for the

21 purpose of feeding only may be exempt from the requirements

of W.S. 11-19-402 if they are placed under quarantine by

23 the rules and regulations promulgated by the Wyoming

24 livestock board.

2 **Section 2.** W.S. 11-19-113 through 11-19-117,

3 11-19-202 through 11-19-204, 11-19-206, 11-19-207,

4 11-19-211 through 11-19-213, 11-19-301 and 11-19-302 are

5 repealed.
