Contagious and infectious diseases among livestock.

Sponsored by: Joint Agriculture, State and Public Lands and Water Resources Interim Committee

## A BILL

#### for

AN ACT relating to contagious and infectious diseases among 1 livestock; revising provisions related to contagious and 2 infectious diseases among livestock and other animals as 3 specified; increasing certain penalties related to diseases 4 among livestock and other animals as specified; repealing 5 obsolete provisions; and providing for an effective date. 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 10 Section 1. W.S. 11-1-103, 11-19-103(a) and (e), 11-19-104(a)(intro), 11-19-108, 11-19-111(a), (b) and (d), 11 11-19-112, 11-19-201(a)(i), by creating a new paragraph 12 and by renumbering (ii) as (iii), 11-19-208, 13 (ii) 11-19-209, 11-19-214, 11-19-215, 11-19-303, 11-19-304, 14

15 11-19-306, 11-19-401, 11-19-402 and 11-19-403 are amended 16 to read:

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### 2 11-1-103. Penalty for violations.

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A person who violates any of the following sections commits 4 5 a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty 6 dollars (\$750.00), or both for the first offense, or by 7 imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, a fine of not 8 9 more than one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00), or 10 both for second or subsequent offenses: W.S. 11-6-210(a) or 11 (f), 11-18-112, 11-19-101, 11-19-102, 11-19-103, 11-19-111, <u>11-19-210, 11</u>-19-215, 11-19-304, 11-19-306, 11-19-401, 12 13 11-20-114, 11-20-117, 11-20-229, 11-20-230, 11-21-104, 11-22-118, 11-23-106, 11-23-207, 11-24-106, 11-30-114 and 14 11-48-102. A person who violates board rules promulgated 15 pursuant to W.S. 11-18-103(a)(v) shall be subject to the 16 17 penalties specified in this section.

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19 11-19-103. Quarantine of diseased animals generally;
20 treatment, testing and vaccination thereof; effect of
21 failure to obey order of state veterinarian; appeal; stay
22 of action.

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In all cases of infectious and contagious disease 1 (a) animals in this state, 2 domestic the state amonq veterinarian may order the quarantine of the infected 3 premises. If the disease becomes epidemic epizootic in any 4 5 locality in this state, the state veterinarian shall immediately notify the governor shall 6 who issue his proclamation forbidding transfer of any animal of the kind 7 among which the epidemic epizootic disease exists from the 8 9 locality without permission from the state veterinarian.

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11 (e) If the owner or persons in charge of animals ordered treated, tested, vaccinated or guarantined after 12 13 reasonable notice determined by the veterinarian, fail to 14 treat, test, vaccinate or quarantine such animals as ordered, the veterinarian may seize or cause such animals 15 to be seized and treated, tested, vaccinated or guarantined 16 17 and may hold and sell the animals, or part thereof as necessary to pay all costs of inspection, seizing, caring 18 for, treating, testing, vaccinating or quarantine together 19 with cost of sale. The sale shall be made at the time and 20 21 place and in the manner prescribed by the veterinarian. Not 22 less than three (3) days nor more than fifteen (15) days notice of the time, place and purpose of the sale shall be 23 given by the veterinarian to the owner or persons in charge 24

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of the animals, by personal service within the county in which the animals are being held if possible, and if not possible then such notice may be given either by personal service outside of the county or by advertisement in any paper selected by the veterinarian. The state veterinarian shall only sell the <u>livestock animals</u> after all other remedies have been exhausted.

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9 11-19-104. Slaughter of diseased animals; authority 10 of veterinarian; slaughtering order; when consent of owner 11 required.

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(a) In any case of <u>epidemic epizootic</u> disease where premises have been previously quarantined by the state veterinarian, he may order the slaughter of any diseased animals upon the premises and all animals that have been exposed to contagion or infection under the following restrictions:

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20 **11-19-108.** Compensation of board.

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22 Each member of a board of arbitration shall receive <del>five</del> 23 <del>dollars (\$5.00) <u>one hundred dollars (\$100.00)</u> for each day 24 actually engaged and employed in the investigation of any</del>

1 claim, paid by the state veterinarian out of an 2 appropriation for that purpose. 3 4 11-19-111. Regulation of importation of animals; 5 prohibited acts; penalties; applicability. 6 (a) The governor, upon recommendation of the Wyoming 7 may regulate by proclamation 8 livestock board, the 9 importation into Wyoming from any other state any 10 livestock, or any virulent blood or live virus of animal, 11 blood, microorganism or biologic agent capable of causing any disease affecting livestock or other animals, or any 12 13 thing other item suspected of being infected or contaminated with livestock disease germs biologic agents 14 capable of causing animal disease, except under such 15 conditions as he deems proper for the protection of the 16 17 livestock, livestock animals as defined in W.S. 11-29-101(a) (vi) and other domestic animals of Wyoming. All 18 requirements in the governor's proclamation shall be 19 enforced by the Wyoming livestock board. 20

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(b) After a proclamation is issued by the governor it is unlawful for any person to import into Wyoming or receive imports within this state from any other state any

livestock, virulent blood or live virus of animal, blood, 1 microorganism or biologic agent capable of causing any 2 3 diseases affecting livestock or other animals, or any product or thing item suspected of being infected or 4 5 contaminated with livestock disease germs biologic agents capable of causing animal disease, except under 6 such conditions as may be imposed by the proclamation. Any 7 person who violates this section shall be punished as 8 9 provided in W.S. 11-1-103. The violator is civilly liable 10 for all damages and loss sustained by any person by reason 11 of violation of the proclamation.

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13 (d) The state veterinarian may inspect, treat, test, vaccinate, quarantine or sell any livestock or other 14 domestic animals imported into Wyoming in violation of W.S. 15 11-19-111 or any rules promulgated thereunder. Any order 16 17 or regulation made by the state veterinarian is subject to review, modification or annulment by the governor or the 18 board at any subsequent meeting. 19

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21 11-19-112. Cooperation with animal and plant health 22 inspection service.

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The state consents to having the bureau of animal industry 1 2 animal and plant health inspection service (APHIS) of the United States department of agriculture and its employees 3 4 come within Wyoming for all purposes connected with the 5 importation and exportation of diseased livestock and for all purposes connected with the eradication, suppression 6 and control of dangerously infectious and contagious 7 diseases of livestock. 8 9 11-19-201. Definitions. 10 11 (a) As used in this act: 12 13 (i) "Dairy cow animal" means any cow, sheep or 14 qoat, the milk or milk products from which is sold or used 15 for human consumption; 16 17 (ii) "Livestock animal" means as defined in W.S. 18 19 11-29-101(a)(vi); 20 21 (ii) "This act" means W.S. 11-19-201 22 through 11-19-215. 23

11-19-208. Ear tags; record to be kept of livestock 1 2 animals tested. 3 Each livestock animal which passes the tested for 4 5 tuberculosis test satisfactorily shall have an official ear tag inserted in its ear. The state testing veterinarian 6 shall see that a correct record is kept of all cattle 7 tested, the date and place of testing, the names and 8 9 addresses of owners and the number of the ear tag inserted 10 in the ear of each animal, and shall report this information in his regular biennial report keep an official 11 record of all livestock animals tested and submit a copy of 12 13 the record to state and federal animal health officials. 14 15 11-19-209. Tests of livestock animals. 16 17 Whenever the state veterinarian suspects that tuberculosis exists or has been introduced by imported dairy cattle 18 19 among any dairy cattle in this state to livestock animals, he shall order the retesting testing of same, regardless of 20 21 any former tests made the livestock animals. 22 11-19-214. Disposition of diseased livestock. 23 24

All livestock animals in Wyoming lawfully found to be 1 2 affected with or exposed to tuberculosis may be shipped 3 disposed on the origin premises or transported under the 4 direction of the state veterinarian in accordance with 5 federal regulations, to livestock markets and there sold for salvage and destroyed or transferred directly to an 6 slaughter facility, rendering facility or 7 approved veterinary diagnostic laboratory in accordance with federal 8 9 regulations. Producers may be eligible for indemnification 10 as provided in W.S. 11-19-106 for any livestock animal 11 ordered disposed pursuant to this section.

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13 11-19-215. Prohibited acts; penalties.

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Any person who intentionally interferes with, refuses to 15 assist in gathering and testing his cattle livestock 16 17 animals, or hinders the work of the state veterinarian or his employees under this act, or who attempts to defeat the 18 object of the tuberculin test by a previous injection of 19 tuberculin commonly known as "plugging," or in any way 20 21 attempts to prevent an accurate and truthful determination 22 of the condition of the cattle livestock animals tested, 23 shall be fined not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more 24 than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) , or imprisoned not more

1	than thirty (30) days, or both punished as provided in W.S.
2	<u>11-1-103</u> .
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4	11-19-303. Appropriations by counties for control of
5	diseases.
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7	The board of county commissioners may appropriate as much
8	money as it deems necessary for the control and eradication
9	of any infectious, contagious or communicable diseases of
10	livestock. The funds shall be used in cooperation with the
11	state veterinarian or the <del>veterinary services, </del> United
12	States department of agriculture, animal and plant health
13	inspection service (APHIS) in testing animals and disposing
14	of diseased animals disclosed by the tests as provided by
15	law.
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17	11-19-304. Prohibition on importation of cattle or
18	bison; penalties.
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20	Any person bringing cattle <u>or bison</u> into any <del>"tuberculosis</del>
21	modified accredited area" tuberculosis accredited-free area
22	except in compliance with the rules and regulations made by
23	the state veterinarian shall upon conviction be punished $\frac{by}{dt}$
24	imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, or by a fine

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1	of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or both as
2	provided in W.S. 11-1-103.
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4	11-19-306. Penalties for violation of rules and
5	regulations.
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7	Any person who violates any lawful rule or regulation made
8	by the state veterinarian pursuant to W.S. 11-19-305 is
9	guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction, shall be
10	punished <del>by imprisonment for not more than one (1) year, or</del>
11	by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00),
12	<del>or both as provided in W.S. 11-1-103</del> .
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14	11-19-401. Tagging, branding and disposition of
15	cattle reacting to test; penalties for failure to comply.
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17	All <del>cattle <mark>livestock animals</mark> in Wyoming reacting to <del>an</del></del>
18	agglutination a confirmatory test for brucellosis (Bang's
19	disease) except reactors under thirty (30) months of age
20	which have been officially vaccinated with brucella abortus
21	vaccine, strain 19, and except officially vaccinated adult
22	animals which were negative to the agglutination test for
	animals which were negative to the aggratimation test for
23	brucellosis within ten (10) days prior to vaccination, must

1 reactor tag and permanently branded with a hot iron letter 2 "B" on the left jaw tailhead by or in the presence of an officially authorized veterinarian. All such reactors must 3 4 reactor livestock animals shall be disposed of for 5 slaughter or diagnostic purposes only, upon and according to written instruction from the Wyoming livestock board. 6 Any person who violates any provision of this section shall 7 be punished as provided in W.S. 11-1-103. As used in this 8 9 section, "confirmatory test" means a test for brucellosis 10 that has the specificity and sensitivity to verify the presence or absence of brucella abortus in animal serum or 11 tissues and is used to confirm results from an initial 12 13 brucellosis test.

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15 11-19-402. Breeding cattle and bison entering state show evidence of negative test or vaccination for 16 to 17 brucellosis; exceptions.

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All breeding cattle and buffalo bison entering Wyoming 19 20 shall be accompanied by a proper health certificate showing 21 evidence of a negative blood test for brucellosis made 22 within thirty (30) days prior to entry, or evidence of being officially vaccinated by a licensed veterinarian 23 during calfhood against brucellosis. Breeding cattle and 24

buffalo bison originating from modified certified brucellosis areas, certified brucellosis free areas and from certified brucellosis free herds entering Wyoming may be exempt from this section but must be accompanied by a proper health certificate.

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7 11-19-403. When cattle or bison exempt from
8 provisions.

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10 Breeding cattle and <u>buffalo</u> <u>bison</u> entering Wyoming for the 11 purpose of feeding only may be exempt from the requirements 12 of W.S. 11-19-402 if they are placed under quarantine by 13 the rules and regulations promulgated by the Wyoming 14 livestock board.

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16 Section 2. W.S. 11-19-113 through 11-19-117, 17 11-19-202 through 11-19-207, 11-19-210 through 11-19-213, 18 11-19-301 and 11-19-302 are repealed.

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20 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2013.
