9 **Section 1.** W.S. 42-4-102(a)(ii) and by creating a new

10 paragraph (xi) is amended to read:

12 **42-4-102.** Definitions.

14 (a) As used in this chapter:

1 (ii) "Medical assistance" means partial or full 2 payment of the reasonable charges assessed by 3 authorized provider of the services and supplies enumerated 4 under W.S. 42-4-103 and consistent with limitations and 5 reimbursement methodologies established by the department, which are provided on behalf of a qualified recipient, 6 excluding those services and supplies provided by any 7 relative of the recipient, unless the relative is a family 8 9 caregiver providing services under a home and community based waiver program, or for cosmetic purposes only; 10 11 (xi) "Family caregiver" means a family member of 12 13 a waiver recipient with a developmental disability or acquired brain injury, who provides waiver services to the 14 person with a developmental disability or acquired brain 15 injury and who meets the requirements for a qualified 16 17 family caregiver as established by rules promulgated by the department. Family caregivers shall be certified by the 18 19 department in the same manner as nonfamily caregivers. For purposes of providing for reimbursement of services to a 20 21 family caregiver, the department shall amend the state plan and apply for a waiver from the centers for Medicaid and 22

Medicare services, as necessary.
