1	(a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) of
2	this section, no person shall operate a passenger vehicle
3	in this state unless each child who is a passenger in that
4	vehicle and who has not reached his ninth birthday is
5	properly secured in a child safety restraint system in a
6	seat of the vehicle other than the front seat, except if
7	the vehicle is only equipped with one (1) row of seats, or
8	if all safety belts in the rows of seats behind the front
9	seat are in use by other child passengers in the vehicle,
10	the child may be properly secured in a child safety
11	restraint system in the front passenger seat of the
12	vehicle, except that a rear-facing infant seat or child
13	safety restraint system shall not be placed in front of an
14	active airbag. For each child who has not reached his
15	second birthday, the infant seat or child safety restraint
16	system required by this subsection shall be rear-facing.

20 (a) Any person who violates this article shall be
21 issued a citation and fined not more than fifty dollars
22 (\$50.00) one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the first
23 offense, provided that the fine shall be waived by the

1 court upon receipt of proof by the court that the offender,

2 after the offense occurred, has purchased, leased or

3 otherwise acquired a child safety restraint system which

4 meets the requirements of this article. For a second or

5 subsequent violation of this article, the offender shall be

6 fined not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) two

7 <u>hundred dollars (\$200.00)</u>.
