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- 12 **Section 1.** W.S. 16-6-101(a)(i)(intro), (J)(III), by
- 13 creating new paragraphs (iii) and (iv) and by renumbering
- 14 (iii) as (v), 16-6-102(c) and 16-6-120(a), (b) (intro),
- 15 (ii), by creating a new subsection (c), by amending and

renumbering (c) as (d) and by renumbering (d) as (e) are 1 2 amended to read: 3 16-6-101. Definitions. 4 5 (a) As used in this act: 6 7 (i) "Resident" 8 means a natural person, 9 association, partnership, limited partnership, registered limited partnership, registered limited liability company 10 or corporation certified as a resident by the department of 11 employment following receipt of an affidavit executed and 12 13 sworn to by the president a chief executive officer of the company or his designee of entity setting forth information 14 required by the department to determine compliance with 15 this act and prior to bidding upon the contract or 16 17 responding to a request for proposal, subject to the following criteria: 18

20 (J) A corporation organized under the laws 21 of any state which has been in existence for two (2) years 22 or more:

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5 16-6-120. Rulemaking; penalties; enforcement.

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- 7 (a) The department of employment shall promulgate
- 8 rules and regulations required as the department determines
- 9 necessary or convenient to enforce this act.

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- 11 (b) A person Unless punishable under subsection (c)
- 12 of this section, an individual, partnership, association,
- 13 limited partnership, registered limited partnership,
- 14 registered limited liability company or corporation and any
- 15 officer or member thereof that intentionally falsifies
- 16 information under this act shall be:

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- 18 (ii) Barred from bidding on any state—contract
- 19 subject to the provisions of this act or submitting any
- 20 request for proposal on any state project subject to the
- 21 provisions of this act for one (1) year from the date the
- 22 violation is corrected.

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1 (c) Any person who signs an affidavit submitted to the department pursuant to W.S. 16-1-101(a), knowing any 2 information contained therein is false, shall be guilty of 3 false swearing punishable as a felony in accordance with 4 5 W.S. 6-5-303(a). 6 The department of employment is authorized and 7 directed to enforce W.S. 16-6-101 through 16-6-206.

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In the event a contractor fails to comply with 10 an order from the department, the director shall refer the 11 matter to the appropriate district or county attorney for 12 13 enforcement of the department's order.

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Section 2. All individuals and entities certified as residents pursuant to W.S. 16-6-101 through 16-6-121 as of 17 the effective date of this act shall reapply for residency certification with the department of workforce services not 18 later than June 30, 2012. The department shall review the 19 20 status of all contractors certified as a resident and shall 21 reissue certifications to all qualifying contractors not 22 later than December 31, 2012. Unless a contractor's residency status is terminated by the department the 23

1 pendency of an application pursuant to this section shall

2 not affect the contractor's residency status.

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4 Section 3.

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6 (a) The president of the senate and the speaker of

the house of representatives shall each appoint three (3)

- 8 members of their respective houses to a select committee on
- 9 resident contractor preference laws. At least one (1)
- 10 member of the select committee shall be from the minority
- 11 party.

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13 (b) The select committee shall:

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15 (i) Elect a chairman;

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- 17 (ii) Review the provisions of W.S. 16-6-101
- 18 through 16-6-121, and other provisions of Wyoming law
- 19 related to contractor preference laws and for public works
- 20 construction projects for the state, state agencies, state
- 21 institutions and political subdivisions of the state. The
- 22 committee shall include in its review the provisions of

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23 2011 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapters 81 and 82;

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1 (iii) Determine whether statutory changes are

2 necessary and desirable to make more uniform laws governing

3 public works construction projects;

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5 (iv) Determine whether statutory changes to

6 contractor preference laws should be made to effectuate the

7 goal of ensuring that all business entities certified as

8 Wyoming residents are at least fifty percent (50%) owned by

9 individuals or entities with an actual presence in Wyoming

10 beyond that necessary to meet minimum requirements to

11 qualify as a resident under W.S. 16-6-101 through 16-6-121;

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13 (v) Be staffed by the legislative service

14 office. State agencies shall provide information and

15 assistance to the select committee as requested.

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17 (c) The select committee shall submit its

18 recommendations, including proposed legislation with respect

19 to the issues specified in subsection (b) of this section,

20 to the joint minerals, business and economic development

21 interim committee no later than October 1, 2012. The joint

22 minerals, business and economic development interim

23 committee shall consider the recommendations and develop

24 legislation it deems appropriate for consideration by the

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25 legislature.

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Members of the select committee shall be paid 2 salary, per diem and mileage as provided in W.S. 28-5-101 3 4 for their official duties as members of the committee.

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6 (e) There is appropriated from the general fund twenty 7 thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) to the legislative service office for payment of salary, per diem and mileage for 8

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(f) The select committee shall terminate December 31, 11

12 2012.

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14 Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 15 16 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 17 Constitution.
