## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the legislature; establishing the select
- 2 committee on the transfer of public land as specified;
- 3 providing a definition; providing a sunset date; providing
- 4 an appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8 Section 1. W.S. 28-11-601 is created to read:

- 10 ARTICLE 6
- 11 SELECT COMMITTEE ON THE TRANSFER OF PUBLIC LAND

- 28-11-601. Appointment of members; powers and duties;
- 14 sunset.

1 (a) Not later than March 15 following each general 2 election, a select committee on the transfer of public land 3 shall be appointed subject to the following:

4

(i) The president of the senate shall appoint three (3) members of the senate apportioned as nearly as possible to reflect the percentage of the elected membership of the majority and minority parties of the senate, provided that not more than five (5) members of the select committee shall be from the same political party;

(ii) The speaker of the house of representatives
shall appoint three (3) members of the house apportioned as
nearly as possible to reflect the percentage of the elected
membership of the majority and minority parties of the
house, provided that not more than five (5) members of the
select committee shall be from the same political party.

21 (i) Select from among its members two (2)
22 members to serve as co-chairmen;

1 (ii) Determine the potential structure of 2 ownership of public lands within the state including 3 consideration of the state owning the surface rights, 4 owning the subsurface rights, managing either the surface 5 or subsurface, or both, or other ownership and management options as determined by the committee; 6 7 (iii) Determine criteria for management 8 9 public lands including consideration of rights currently existing under federal law; 10 11 (iv) Consider methods for the federal government 12 13 to divest public lands held within the state including consideration of legal action and congressional action; 14 15 legislation 16 (v) Develop and introduce 17 necessary related to the acquisition or management of public lands. 18 19 20 (C) The select committee may secure consulting 21 services, if necessary, to provide technical assistance in compiling information related to public lands within the 22 state or other issues related to the transfer of public 23

- 2 (d) As used in this section, "public lands" means any
- 3 surface or subsurface lands within the boundaries of the
- 4 state, title to which is held by the federal government.
- 5 "Public lands" shall not include any land within the
- 6 boundaries of a designated national park, designated
- 7 national monument or wilderness area designated under the
- 8 national wilderness preservation system.

- 10 (e) This section is repealed effective January 1,
- 11 2018.

- 15 (a) Notwithstanding W.S. 28-11-601(a) as created by
- 16 this act, not later than ten (10) days after the effective
- 17 date of this act, a select committee on the transfer of
- 18 public lands shall be appointed as follows:

- 20 (i) The president of the senate shall appoint
- 21 three (3) members of the senate apportioned as nearly as
- 22 possible to reflect the percentage of the elected
- 23 membership of the majority and minority parties of the

1 senate, provided that not more than five (5) members of the

2 select committee shall be from the same political party;

(ii) The speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint three (3) members of the house apportioned as nearly as possible to reflect the percentage of the elected membership of the majority and minority parties of the house, provided that not more than five (5) members of the

select committee shall be from the same political party.

Section 3. There is appropriated twenty thousand 11 dollars (\$20,000.00) from general 12 the fund to the 13 legislative service office. This appropriation shall only be expended to provide salary, travel and per diem to 14 members of the select committee on the transfer of public 15 land for meetings held from the effective date of this act 16 17 through June 30, 2016 and for retaining consulting services as necessary pursuant to W.S. 28-11-601(c). Notwithstanding 18 any other provision of law, this appropriation shall not be 19 20 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any 21 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this 22 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 23 2016.

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
