## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to offenses against property; renaming the
- 2 crime of larceny and modifying elements of the crime;
- 3 removing offenses of rustling and unlawful taking of motor
- 4 vehicle fuel from the renamed theft statute; modifying
- 5 elements of rustling; clarifying and modifying penalties
- 6 for certain offenses regarding failure to obtain a brand
- 7 permit; repealing unnecessary provisions; conforming
- 8 statutes; and providing for an effective date.

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 12 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-3-412 and 6-3-413 are created to
- 13 read:

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- 15 6-3-412. Unlawful taking of motor vehicle fuel;
- 16 penalties.

(a) A person who causes a motor vehicle to leave the 2 premises of an establishment at which motor vehicle fuel is 3 offered for retail sale without the person making full 4 5 payment for motor fuel that was dispensed into the fuel tank of a motor vehicle or into another container is guilty 6 of unlawful taking of motor vehicle fuel. Any person 7 convicted of a second or subsequent offense under this 8 9 section shall have his driver's license suspended pursuant to W.S. 31-7-128. The court shall forward to the department 10 of transportation a copy of the record pertaining to 11 disposition of the arrest or citation. In addition: 12

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(i) A first conviction under this section is
punishable by a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty
dollars (\$750.00), imprisonment for not more than six (6)
months, or both;

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19 (ii) A second or subsequent conviction under 20 this section is punishable by a fine of not more than one 21 thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), imprisonment for not more 22 than six (6) months, or both.

- 7 is a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than
- 8 ten (10) years, a fine of not more than ten thousand
