1	AN ACT relating to school facilities projects; providing
2	appropriations for school facility projects for the
3	biennial period July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2016;
4	providing definitions; requiring reporting; and providing
5	for effective dates.

7	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
8	
9	Section 1.
10	
11	(a) This act shall consist of the 2015-2016 biennial
12	school capital construction appropriation.
13	
14	(b) As used in this section:
15	
16	(i) "Condition needs index priority" means the
17	condition needs index priority used by the school

1 facilities commission in developing the remediation 2 schedule for the 2015-2016 biennial budget recommendation 3 in accordance with W.S. 21-15-117(a)(i);

5 (ii) "Capacity" means building needs as measured 6 by criteria established by the school facilities commission 7 pursuant to W.S. 21-15-117(e);

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9 (iii) "Previous" means continuation of projects 10 prioritized by condition needs indices in effect prior to 11 the index developed for the 2015-2016 biennial budget 12 recommendation.

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14 (C) The amounts appropriated from the school capital construction account under this act are for the biennial 15 period commencing July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2016. 16 As authorized under W.S. 21-15-119(a)(iii), the school 17 facilities commission shall submit a supplemental budget 18 request for the period beginning July 1, 2015, and ending 19 20 June 30, 2016, for any emergency or unanticipated need, or 21 for any refinement or modification of a project funded 22 under this section, subject to any constraints and other requirements imposed by the governor under W.S. 9-2-1013. 23

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1 (d) An estimated schedule for deploying projects 2 funded by amounts appropriated under this section and 3 projects funded by previous appropriations, as adopted by the school facilities commission and contained within 4 5 Appendix A to the 2015-2016 biennial budget submitted by the commission under W.S. 21-15-119, shall be used by the 6 school facilities department in guiding the expenditure of 7 appropriated funds. The estimated schedule developed under 8 9 this subsection shall be based upon information, processes, 10 events and expenditures and shall not be binding upon the 11 department or the commission. Amounts appropriated under this section and previous appropriations shall 12 not be 13 construed to be an entitlement or guaranteed amount and shall be expended by the commission and department to 14 ensure adequate, efficient and cost effective school 15 facilities in accordance 16 buildings and with W.S. 17 21-15-114(a)(vii). In addition to accounting requirements imposed under W.S. 28-11-301(c)(iv), the school facilities 18 department shall develop a process for reporting at least 19 20 once each year, the deployment of amounts funding projects 21 under this section and previous appropriations in 22 accordance with the deployment schedule, depicting project progression and if applicable, the rationale for deviation 23 24 from the estimated schedule. The reports, as approved by

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the commission, shall be submitted by the department to the 1 2 select committee on school facilities, the joint education 3 interim committee, the joint appropriations interim 4 committee and the governor. 5 (e) The following amounts are appropriated from the 6 school capital construction account to the 7 school facilities commission for the fiscal biennium beginning 8 July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2016, for the specified 9 purposes: 10 11 (i) For planning projects: 12 13 (A) Up to one hundred thousand dollars 14 (\$100,000.00), subject to the prescribed maximum amounts: 15 16 17 Condition Needs 18 Index School Maximum 19 20 Priority District Project Amount 21 22 Capacity Washakie #1 Elementary School \$ 50,000 7 Washakie #2 K-12 School \$ 23 50,000 \$ 100,000 24 Total

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2 In addition to the amounts appropriated (B) 3 under subparagraph (A) of this paragraph, up to two hundred 4 fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) for planning projects 5 approved by the school facilities commission. Except as otherwise specified in this subparagraph, the 6 amounts appropriated under this subparagraph shall 7 only be available for expenditure as specifically authorized by the 8 9 legislature. The school facilities commission may through 10 the school facilities department, use the B-11 process as 11 provided under W.S. 9-2-1005(b) to expend amounts appropriated under this subparagraph prior to legislative 12 13 authorization required under this subparagraph. In reporting to the legislature proposed expenditures of 14 amounts appropriated under this 15 subparagraph, the commission shall include the 16 evaluation of remedies 17 addressing facility needs for Campbell County School District No. 1, Fremont County School District No. 1, 18 Laramie County School District No. 1, Natrona County School 19 20 District No. 1, Niobrara County School District No. 1 and 21 Sheridan County School District No. 2. 22
