Permanent absentee voter status.

1 AN ACT relating to elections; modifying provisions related 2 to absentee ballot applications; authorizing an elector to apply for an absentee ballot electronically; authorizing an 3 elector to apply for permanent absentee voter status and to 4 5 receive an absentee ballot for all subsequent elections as 6 specified; requiring distribution of absentee ballots to 7 electors who qualify for permanent absentee voter status as specified; specifying termination of permanent absentee 8 voter status; requiring rulemaking; and providing for an 9 10 effective date.

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1 **Section 1.** W.S. 22-9-104(a)(intro), (i) and by creating a new paragraph (vi), 22-9-105 and 22-9-107 are 2 3 amended to read: 4 22-9-104. How to apply; information required. 5 6 (a) A qualified elector may apply for an absentee 7 8 ballot either in person, in writing, electronically or by telephone, by furnishing the following information: 9 10 11 (i) Legal name in full, social security number 12 (optional), date of birth, and current Wyoming residence address by street, city, county, and zip code or last 13 Wyoming residence address and month and year of leaving 14 Wyoming to live temporarily in another state or nation, if 15 16 applicable; 17 18 (vi) The request for permanent absentee voter 19 status if desired. 20 21 22-9-105. Application; permanent absentee voter 22 status.

1	(a) A qualified elector may apply for an absentee
2	ballot at anytime any time during the calendar year in
3	which the election is held, but not on the day of the
4	election <u>being held</u> .
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6	(b) When applying for an absentee ballot pursuant to
7	subsection (a) of this section, a qualified elector may
8	request permanent absentee voter status to receive an
9	absentee ballot for all subsequent elections conducted in
10	the precinct in which the elector is eligible to vote. An
11	elector's permanent absentee voter status terminates upon:
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13	(i) The elector's request;

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1 The return of a permanent absentee ballot (V) confirmation form sent in accordance with W.S. 22-9-107(c) 2 3 as undeliverable. 4 5 22-9-107. Delivering ballots to qualified applicants; permanent absentee voter confirmation forms. 6 7 8 If the clerk determines that the applicant is (a) entitled to vote, he shall mark the application "Accepted" 9 10 and shall, not more than forty-five (45) days prior to the 11 election, distribute to the applicant, or the individual 12 designated by the applicant, the absentee ballot or ballots 13 requested, instructions for marking the ballot and the required envelopes for use in returning the ballot. 14 15 16 (b) If the clerk determines that the applicant is qualified for permanent absentee voter status, the clerk 17 18 shall place the applicant's name on a list. The clerk 19 shall distribute an absentee ballot to each elector on the 20 list for all elections conducted in the precinct for which 21 the elector is eligible to vote. The clerk shall remove 22 from the list any elector whose permanent absentee voter 23 status is terminated and shall not distribute an absentee

ballot to the elector for any subsequent election unless
the elector reapplies for an absentee ballot in accordance
with W.S. 22-9-105.
(c) In January of each even-numbered year, the clerk
shall mail a nonforwarding address confirmation form to
each elector on the list maintained pursuant to subsection
(b) of this section. The form shall:
(i) Be developed by rule of the secretary of
state in conjunction with county clerks;
(ii) Apply to all elections to be held between
February 1 following the mailing of the form through
January of the next even-numbered year.
Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2017.
