- (a) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008, 9-2-1012(e) and 17

- 20 hereby reappropriated to the legislative service office for

(ii) Any balance remaining on June 30, 2016, resulting from the sale of legislative laptop computers prior to that date is appropriated to the legislative service office to be used for the purchase of replacement laptop computers and support systems for the period July 1, 23 2016 through June 30, 2018.

15	(a) From and after the date the state canvassing
16	board certifies the results of the 2016 general election in
17	accordance with W.S. 22-16-118, legislators elect and newly
18	appointed legislators may, to the extent authorized by the
19	Management Council, receive mileage and per diem at the
20	same rate as members of the legislature plus an amount
21	equal to the daily salary paid to legislators for each day

22 spent at a legislative training function or at a meeting of

23 an interim committee to which they will be assigned.

2	(b) There is appropriated from the general fund to
3	the legislative service office sixty-two thousand dollars
4	(\$62,000.00) or as much thereof as may be necessary for
5	purposes of this section.

7	(c) As used in this section:

9	(i) "Legislator elect" means a person elected to
10	the legislature during the 2016 general election who is not
11	a current member of the legislature and before the person
12	is duly sworn in;

14	(ii) "Newly appointed legislator" means a person
15	appointed after the 2016 general election to fill a vacancy
16	in the House or Senate and before the person is duly sworn
17	in.

19	Section 7. [Reappropriation of School Foundation
20	Program Account Funds].

22	(a) Notwithstanding W.S. $9-2-1008$, $9-2-1012$ (e) and
23	9-4-207(a), any unexpended, unobligated monies appropriated

Τ	from the school foundation program account to the attorney
2	general under 2014 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 26,
3	Section 2, Section 015, for purposes of the school finance
4	litigation law office shall not revert on June 30, 2016,
5	and are reappropriated for expenditure by the legislative

17	unexpended, unobligated amounts appropriated to the
18	governor's office under 2015 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter
19	112, Section 2(b) is transferred from the governor's office
20	and reappropriated to the legislative service office for
21	the period commencing with the effective date of this

- 19 efforts to expand and diversify Wyoming's energy and
- industrial economy or to attract new business enterprises to 20
- 21 the state or to improve access to and growth in domestic and
- 22 international markets, are authorized reimbursement of

- 1 actual travel expenses, including travel, lodging, meals and
- 2 necessary incidentals, provided:

There is appropriated from the capitol building rehabilitation and restoration account to the 5 6 legislative service office forty thousand (\$40,000.00) for meeting per diem, salary and mileage of 7 8 legislators serving on the capitol building rehabilitation 9 and restoration oversight group. 10 11 **Section 13.** [Effective Dates]. 12 13 (a) As used in this act, "effective immediately" means effective immediately upon completion of all acts 14 necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 15 16 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. Any appropriation 17 contained in this act that is effective immediately shall not lapse until June 30, 2018, unless otherwise specified. 18 19 20 (b) Except as otherwise provided, this act is 21 effective July 1, 2016. 22
