4 agency established to detect and prevent fraud pursuant to

5 an examination made under this chapter or any other

6 <u>investigation</u>, if the act of communication or delivery was

7 performed in good faith and without fraudulent intent.

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9 (c) Any person identified in subsection (a) or (b) of this section shall be entitled to an award of attorney's 10 fees and costs if he is a prevailing party in a civil cause 11 of action for libel, slander or any other relevant tort 12 13 arising out of activities in carrying out an examination or 14 related activity under the provisions of this chapter and the party bringing the action was not substantially 15 justified in doing so. For purposes of this section, a 16 proceeding is "substantially justified" if 17 it reasonable basis in law or fact at the time 18 it was

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initiated.
