A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government;
- 2 creating a task force on geothermal energy; providing for
- 3 membership and duties of the task force; requiring a
- 4 report; providing for executive department staffing of the
- 5 task force; providing for legislative liaisons; providing
- 6 an appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

10 Section 1.

12 (a) There is created the task force on geothermal

13 energy consisting of the following members:

1 (i) A member knowledgeable of the oil and gas 2 industry appointed by the oil and gas conservation 3 commission; 4 5 (ii) Two (2) members of the public, one (1) appointed by the governor and one (1) appointed jointly by 6 the president of the senate and speaker of the house of 7 8 representatives; 9 (iii) A representative of the University of 10 Wyoming's school of energy resources appointed by the 11 12 president of the University; 13 14 (iv) A representative of the Wyoming energy authority appointed by the board of the authority; 15 16 17 (v) A representative of the water development commission appointed by the commission; 18 19 20 (vi) A representative of the geological survey appointed by the state geologist. 21

1 (b) The task force shall select one (1) of members to serve as chair. All members shall serve without 2 3 compensation for task force service. Members who are not 4 state employees shall be paid per diem and mileage for attending meetings of the task force in the manner and 5 amounts provided by law for legislators. State employee 6 members of the task force shall be paid per diem and 7 8 mileage by their agencies for attending meetings of the task force and shall suffer no loss of wages for the time 9 devoted to attending meetings of the task force. 10 11 geological survey shall provide administrative and clerical 12 services to the task force. State agencies shall provide information and assistance to the task force as requested 13 by the task force in carrying out its duties. Up to two 14 (2) representatives and one (1) senate member of the joint 15 16 minerals business and economic development 17 committee may be appointed by the chairmen of the committee to act as legislative liaisons to the task force, with 18 19 authority to attend task force meetings but without 20 authority to vote.

1	(c) The task force shall review the potential
2	development of geothermal energy for residential,
3	commercial and industrial use in Wyoming including:
4	
5	(i) Geothermal resources as a means to produce
6	electrical energy;
7	
8	(ii) The potential for cooperative ventures
9	between developers of oil and gas resources and producers
10	of geothermal energy;
11	
12	(iii) Potential impact from the development of
13	geothermal reservoirs on existing tourism and other uses of
14	geothermal resources;
15	
16	(iv) The potential for cooperative
17	public/private ventures to develop geothermal resources;
18	
19	(v) Possible measures to provide an environment
20	conducive to development of geothermal resources.
21	
22	(d) The task force shall submit its findings and any

23 recommendations for statutory modifications to support

- 1 geothermal energy development to the joint minerals,
- 2 business and economic development interim committee no
- 3 later than November 1, 2021. The committee shall review
- 4 the findings and recommendations and may sponsor any
- 5 legislation it deems appropriate for consideration by the
- 6 legislature.

7

- 8 (e) Members of the task force shall be appointed
- 9 within fifteen (15) days of the effective date of this act.

10

- 11 (f) The task force shall exist until December 31,
- 12 2021.

13

- 14 **Section 2.** There is appropriated seven thousand
- 15 dollars (\$7,000.00) from the general fund to the geological
- 16 survey for mileage and per diem for members of the task
- 17 force who are not state employees as authorized in section
- 18 1 of this act. This appropriation shall be for the period
- 19 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending
- 20 December 31, 2021. This appropriation shall not be
- 21 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any
- 22 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this

2 2022.

4 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,

5 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

6 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

7 Constitution.
