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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 1-39-117(a), 5-9-128 by creating a
- 8 new subsection (e) and 7-2-106(c) are amended to read:

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- 10 1-39-117. Jurisdiction; appeals; venue; trial by
- 11 jury; liability insurance.

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- 13 (a) Original and exclusive concurrent jurisdiction
- 14 for any claim filed in state court under this act shall be
- 15 in the district courts of Wyoming or in the circuit courts

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of Wyoming pursuant to W.S. 5-9-128(e). Appeals may be
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    taken as provided by law.
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        5-9-128. Civil jurisdiction.
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        (e) Each circuit court has original and concurrent
    jurisdiction with the district courts of Wyoming within the
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    boundaries of the state for an action brought under the
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    Wyoming Governmental Claims Act, where the prayer for
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    recovery is an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars
    ($50,000.00) exclusive of costs.
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        7-2-106. Extraterritorial authority of
    officers; requests for assignment of peace officers;
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    liability; compensation.
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        (c) A peace officer acting pursuant to subsection
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    (a), (b) or (f) of this section outside his
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    jurisdiction, or a peace officer when providing
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    enforcement assistance on the Wind River Indian Reservation
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    pursuant to a memorandum of understanding entered in
    advance and approved by the attorney general, between the
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    department of the interior, Federal Bureau of Indian
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Affairs or the tribes and the state, county, city or town 1 2 providing the assistance, shall be deemed to be acting 3 within the scope of his duties for purposes of the Wyoming 4 Governmental Claims Act and the state self-insurance program, W.S. 1-41-101 through 1-41-111, or the local 5 government self-insurance program, W.S. 1-42-201 through 6 1-42-206. The memorandum of understanding shall contain a 7 8 provision for immunity from suit in tribal court for 9 activities occurring pursuant to any law enforcement 10 assistance provided under this subsection. Any 11 relating to those activities shall be brought only under 12 the terms of the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act in the 13 state district court having jurisdiction, or in the federal district court for the district of Wyoming, if appropriate. 14 15 All privileges and immunities from liability, and all 16 pension, disability, worker's compensation and other 17 benefits which normally apply to peace officers while they perform their duties in their own jurisdiction shall also 18 19 apply to them when acting as provided in subsection (a), 20 (b) or (f) of this section and shall apply to peace 21 officers when providing law enforcement assistance on the Wind River Indian Reservation pursuant to this subsection. 22 23 For purposes of W.S. 27-14-104 and subsection (a), (b) or

(f) of this section, the requesting and assigning law enforcement agencies shall be a joint employer as defined under W.S. 27-14-102(a)(xix) and the designated peace officer shall be a joint employee as defined under W.S. 27-14-102(a)(xxi).

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2016.
