1 AN ACT relating to railroads; establishing certain

2 requirements for the operation of railroads; providing a

3 definition; providing for a criminal offense and for a

4 penalty; and providing for an effective date.

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 37-9-1401 and 37-9-1402 are created

14 37-9-1401. Safety on railroads.

2 a misdemeanor and upon conviction is subject to the

3 penalties provided in subsection (d) of this section if the

6 (i) Fails to provide comfortable and convenient

7 cars or coaches for the transportation of its passengers

8 and their baggage or safe cars for the transportation of

9 express matter and freight;

10

11 (ii) Operates a railroad train over an unsafe

12 bridge, trestlework or aqueduct;

13

14 (iii) Operates a railroad train which is not

15 equipped with a properly functioning horn and bell;

16

17 (iv) Permits a railroad train to approach a

18 public highway, public road or public railroad crossing

19 without causing the horn and bell of the railroad train to

20 be sounded at the distance from the crossing as provided in

21 subsection (b) of this section; or

22

(v) Willfully fails to make any report required

24 by law.

2 (b) For the purposes of paragraph (a)(iv) of this 3 section:

4

5 (i) The horn and bell of a railroad train shall
6 be sounded from a point not less than one thousand three
7 hundred twenty (1,320) feet from the crossing until the
8 crossing is occupied, but if a train has stopped within one
9 thousand three hundred twenty (1,320) feet of a crossing,
10 the horn and bell shall be sounded for a minimum of fifteen
11 (15) seconds prior to the train occupying the crossing;

12

13 (ii) The railroad company shall erect maintain a sign at a minimum of one thousand three hundred 14 twenty (1,320) feet in advance of a crossing at which the 15 horn and bell are required to be sounded to notify the 16 17 railroad crew in advance of a crossing that requires the railroad train horn and bell to be sounded; 18

20 (iii) Ιf of private the owner land 21 includes a railroad crossing makes a written request to the 22 railroad company to have the horn and bell of the railroad train sounded at the private crossing, the railroad shall 23 24 comply with the request and failure to sound the horn and

- 1 bell after such a request shall be considered a violation
- 2 of paragraph (a)(iv) of this section. An owner is not
- 3 subject to any liability as a result of not making a
- 4 request pursuant to this paragraph;

5

- 6 (iv) If the owner of private land which includes
- 7 a railroad crossing makes a written request to the railroad
- 8 company to not have the horn and bell of a railroad train
- 9 sounded at the private crossing, the railroad shall comply
- 10 with the request and shall remove any sign erected pursuant
- 11 to paragraph (ii) of this subsection.

12

- 13 (c) As used in this section, "public highway, public
- 14 road or public railroad crossing" means that the easement,
- 15 right-of-way, or fee title for the public highway, public
- 16 road or public railroad crossing is held in the name of a
- 17 federal, state, tribal or local government entity on both
- 18 sides of the crossing.

19

- 20 (d) Upon conviction of the offenses provided in
- 21 subsection (a) of this section, a railroad company is

22 subject to a fine of:

23

1 (i) Not more than one thousand dollars

2 (\$1,000.00) for the first offense;

3

4 (ii) Not more than two thousand dollars

5 (\$2,000.00) for the second violation of the same provision;

6 and

7

8 (iii) Not less than five thousand dollars

9 (\$5,000.00) or more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00)

10 for the third or subsequent violation of the same

11 provision.

13 37-9-1402. Establishment of railroad quiet zones.

14

15 (a) As used in this section, "quiet zone" means a

16 segment of a railroad which contains one (1) or a number of

17 consecutive railroad crossings at which locomotive horns

18 and bells are not routinely sounded.

19

20 (b) The governing body of a municipality or a board

21 of county commissioners may petition to the secretary of

22 the United States department of transportation to establish

23 quiet zones at railroad crossings that meet the

24 requirements established in the rules adopted to implement

1 49 U.S.C. 20153(c). In developing the petition, the

2 governing body of the municipality or the board of county

3 commissioners shall consult with the railroad corporations

4 that operate the rail lines through crossings that are

5 within the proposed quiet zone. The petition must include

6 how the municipality or county intends to implement the

7 supplemental safety measures that are required by the

8 United States department of transportation at railroad

9 crossings within quiet zones.

10

11 (c) A quiet zone shall not be established at a

12 railroad crossing unless the governing body of a

13 municipality or a board of county commissioners follows the

14 procedure provided in subsection (b) of this section and

15 receives the approval of the secretary of the United States

16 department of transportation or the secretary's designee.

18 **Section 2.** W.S. 31-5-510(a)(iii) is amended to read:

20 31-5-510. Railroad crossings generally.

21

22 (a) Whenever any person driving a vehicle approaches

23 a railroad grade crossing under any of the circumstances

24 stated in this section, the driver of the vehicle shall

	1	stop	within	fifty	(50)	feet	but	not	less	than	fifteen	(15

- 2 feet from the nearest rail of the railroad, and shall not
- 3 proceed until he can do so safely. The foregoing

- 6 (iii) A railroad train approaching within
- 7 approximately one thousand five hundred (1,500) feet of the
- 8 highway crossing emits a signal audible from such distance,
- 9 except at crossings within quiet zones established under
- 10 W.S. 37-9-1402, and the railroad train, by reason of its
- 11 speed or nearness to the crossing, is an immediate hazard;
