9 **Section 1.** W.S. 7-13-105(b)(intro), (c)(i), (ii) and

10 (d) is amended to read:

7-13-105. Certificate of restoration of rights;

13 procedure for restoration in general; procedure for

14 restoration of voting rights for nonviolent felonies;

15 filing requirements.

2 (b) The department of corrections shall issue a 3 certificate of restoration of voting rights as provided in 4 this subsection and subsection (c) of this section. Upon issuance of a certificate, voting rights lost pursuant to 5 W.S. 6-10-106 shall be deemed restored. The department of 6 corrections shall automatically issue a person convicted of 7 8 a nonviolent felony or nonviolent felonies arising out of 9 the same occurrence or related course of events a 10 certificate of restoration of voting rights if: if the person has completed all of his sentence, including 11 12 probation and parole.

(c) The department of corrections shall issue a certificate of restoration of voting rights to eligible persons as follows:

19 nonviolent felony, or nonviolent felonies arising out of
20 the same occurrence or related course of events, the
21 department shall require an application for restoration
22 before issuing a certificate to identify eligible persons
23 who completed their sentence before January 1, 2016 and

issue a certificate of restoration of voting rights to each 1 2 eligible person. The department shall not require an 3 application for restoration before issuing a certificate to 4 eligible persons; who complete their sentence after January 1, 2016; 5 6 (ii) For persons convicted outside of Wyoming or 7 8 under federal law of a nonviolent felony, or nonviolent 9 felonies arising out of the same occurrence or related 10 course of events, the department shall require an application for restoration before issuing a certificate to 11 12 an eligible person issue each eligible person a certificate 13 of restoration of voting rights upon receipt of a written 14 request on a form prescribed by the department and following a determination that the person has completed his 15 16 sentence, including probation and parole. 17 18 department's denial of department of (d) 19 correction's determination that a person is ineligible for 20 a certificate of restoration of voting rights is a final 21 action of the agency subject to judicial review. The clerk of the district court and the division of criminal 22 investigation shall cooperate with the department of 23

1	corrections in providing information necessary for
2	determining a person's eligibility to receive a certificate
3	of restoration of voting rights. The department of
4	corrections shall notify the secretary of state when any
5	person's voting rights have been restored. If the person
6	was convicted in Wyoming, the department of corrections
7	shall submit the certificate of restoration of voting
8	rights to the clerk of the district court in which the
9	person was convicted and the clerk shall file the
10	certificate in the criminal case in which the conviction
11	was entered. If the person is a Wyoming resident at the
12	time the certificate of restoration of voting rights is
13	issued, the department of corrections shall notify the
14	county clerk in the county in which the person resides that
15	the person's voting rights have been restored.

18	(e)(i) is repealed.
