1 AN ACT relating to marketing homemade foods; authorizing 2 the sale of certain homemade food items by parties other 3 than the producer of the item as specified; providing and

4 amending definitions; making conforming changes; repealing

5 a provision relating to consumption location; providing

6 limitations on retail food sales; and providing for an

7 effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-49-102(a)(vi), by creating new

Definitions. 3 4 (a) As used in this act: 5 6 (vi) "Producer" means any person who grows, 7 harvests, prepares or processes any food or drink products 8 on the person's owned or leased property, does not produce 9 more than two hundred fifty thousand (250,000) individual 10 food or drink products annually and does not exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) in gross revenue 11 12 annually; 13 (ix) "Non-potentially hazardous food" means food 14 that does not require time or temperature control for 15 safety including limiting pathogenic microorganism growth 16 or toxin formation. "Non-potentially hazardous food" 17 includes, but is not limited to, jams, uncut fruits and 18 19 vegetables, pickled vegetables, hard candies, fudge, nut 20 mixes, granola, dry soup mixes excluding meat based soup 21 mixes, coffee beans, popcorn and baked goods that do not include dairy or meat frosting or filling or other 22 potentially hazardous frosting or filling; 23

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2	(x) "Potentially hazardous food" means food that
3	requires time or temperature control for safety including
4	limiting pathogenic microorganism growth or toxin
5	formation. "Potentially hazardous food" includes, but is
6	not limited to, foods requiring refrigeration, dairy
7	products, quiches, pizzas, frozen doughs, meat and cooked
8	vegetables and beans;

10	(ix)(xi) "This act" means W.S. 11-49-101 through

13	11-49-103. Wyoming Food Freedom Act; purpose;
14	exemptions; assumption of risk.
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16	(a) The purpose of the Wyoming Food Freedom Act is to
17	allow for a producer's production and sale of homemade food
18	or drink products for an informed end consumer's home
19	consumption consumer and to encourage the expansion of
20	agricultural sales at farmers markets, ranches, farms and
21	producers' homes by:

1	(b) <u>Unless otherwise provided in this section</u> ,
2	homemade food products produced, sold and consumed in
3	compliance with the Wyoming Food Freedom Act shall be
4	exempt from state licensure, permitting, inspection,
5	packaging and labeling requirements.
6	
7	(c) Transactions under this act shall:
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9	(i) Be directly between the producer seller and
10	the informed end consumer. The seller of a homemade food
11	product consisting of non-potentially hazardous food may be
12	the producer of the item, an agent of the producer or a
13	third party vendor including a retail shop or grocery store
14	as long as the sale is made in compliance with this act.
15	The seller of a homemade food item consisting of
16	potentially hazardous food shall be the producer of the
17	<u>item</u> ;
18	
19	(vi) Only occur at farmers markets, farms,
20	ranches, producer's homes or offices, the retail location
21	of the third party seller of non-potentially hazardous
22	<u>foods</u> or any location the producer and the informed end

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2	(d) Except for raw, unprocessed fruits and
3	vegetables, food shall not be sold or used in any
4	commercial food establishment unless the food has been
5	labeled, licensed, packaged, regulated or inspected as
6	required by law. Nothing in this section shall prohibit the
7	sale of homemade food for home consumption from a retail
8	space located at the ranch, farm or home where the food is
9	produced or at the retail location of a third party seller
10	for non-potentially hazardous food. A retail space selling
11	homemade food under this section shall inform the end
12	consumer that the homemade food has not been inspected and
13	shall display a sign indicating that the homemade food has
14	not been inspected. If the a retail space selling
15	potentially hazardous food is in any way associated with a
16	commercial food establishment or offers for sale any
17	inspected product, the retail space selling potentially
18	<pre>hazardous homemade food shall comply with rules adopted by</pre>
19	the department of agriculture which shall require:

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(e) The producer shall inform the end consumer that any food product or food sold at a farmers market or through ranch, farm or home based sales pursuant to this

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    for sales of non-potentially hazardous food at a retail
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    location or grocery store the food shall not be displayed
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    or offered for sale on the same shelf or display as food
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    produced in a licensed establishment and shall be clearly
    and prominently labeled with "this food was made in a home
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    kitchen, is not regulated or inspected and may contain

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         Section 2. W.S. 11-49-103(c)(ii) is repealed.
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         Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2020.
