- 1 AN ACT relating to nuclear energy; providing for a study of
- 2 nuclear energy production; creating a task force; requiring

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8 Section 1.

- 10 (a) There is created a task force on nuclear energy
- 11 production consisting of the following members:

12

- 13 (i) Two (2) members of the Wyoming senate,
- 14 appointed by the president of the senate. One (1) of the
- 15 members shall be designated as cochairman;

1	(ii) Two (2) members of the Wyoming house of
2	representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house. One
3	(1) of the members shall be designated as cochairman;
4	
5	(iii) Three (3) members appointed by the
6	governor. One (1) of the members shall have a background in
7	energy production, one (1) shall be a member of the
8	geological survey board and one (1) shall have a background
9	in revenue and taxation.
10	
11	(b) The task force shall be staffed by the legislative
12	service office. State agencies shall provide information and
13	assistance to the task force as requested.
14	
15	(c) The task force shall study the following, as they
16	relate to nuclear energy production:
17	
18	(i) Potential incentives to encourage nuclear
19	energy production in this state including taxation issues,
20	use of unappropriated waters of the state and private and
21	public sector partnerships;
22	
23	(ii) State regulatory provisions unduly
24	restricting the development of nuclear power production;

(iii) The role of local land use planning;

1 (iv) Any relevant federal statutes that may

2 preempt or limit state or county authority;

4 (v) Storage and reprocessing technologies,

5 including short term and long term storage issues;

7 (vi) The role of higher education within the

8 state in developing nuclear energy production;

9

10 (vii) Other issues the task force may consider

11 useful in encouraging appropriate nuclear energy production

12 in the state, including avoidance of duplicative or

13 conflicting requirements.

14

15 (d) The task force shall submit its recommendations,

16 including proposed legislation with respect to the issues

17 specified in subsection (c) of this section, to the joint

18 minerals, business and economic development interim

19 committee and the governor no later than November 1, 2010.

20 The joint minerals, business and economic development

21 interim committee shall consider the recommendations and

22 develop legislation it deems appropriate for consideration

23 by the legislature in the 2011 general and budget session.

25 (e) The task force shall exist until December 31,

26 2010. Members of the task force who are not state employees

27 or legislators shall not receive a salary but shall receive

1 reimbursement for mileage and per diem expenses at the rate

2 provided for legislators under W.S. 28-5-101. Members of

3 the task force who are legislators shall be paid salary, per

4 diem and mileage as provided in W.S. 28-5-101 for their

5 official duties as members of the task force.

7 (f) There is appropriated from the general fund:

8

9 (i) Eighteen thousand dollars (\$18,000.00) to the

10 legislative service office for payment of salary, per diem

11 and mileage for legislative task force members;

12

13 (ii) Eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) to the

14 governor's office for payment of authorized per diem and

15 mileage for nonlegislative task force members.

16

17 **Section 2.** This act is effective immediately upon

18 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

19 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

20 Constitution.
