for

1 AN ACT relating to civil and criminal procedure; providing a privilege for journalists who refuse to disclose news 2 3 information as specified; specifying applicability; and providing for an effective date. 4 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 6 7 8 Section 1. W.S. 1-12-701 through 1-12-707 are created 9 to read: 10 11 ARTICLE 7 12 PRIVILEGED COMMUNICATIONS 13 1-12-701. Journalist privilege to refuse to disclose 14 15 news information.

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2 (a) A current or former journalist shall have a 3 privilege to refuse to disclose and to prevent the 4 disclosure of any news information obtained or received in 5 confidence or the identity of the source of the information 6 if the journalist:

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(i) Obtains or receives the information, with or 8 9 without solicitation, in the course of gathering or 10 obtaining news for publication in or with a newspaper, 11 magazine, news media, press association, wire service, 12 website or other professional medium or agency that has as 13 one of its principal functions the processing and 14 researching of news intended for publication or for broadcast by a radio station or television network; and 15 16

(ii) When the information was obtained or received, was employed by or was otherwise in a news gathering capacity with a newspaper, magazine, news media, press association, wire service, website, radio station, television network or other professional medium or agency.

23 1-12-702. Privileged information; prohibitions.

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2 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and 3 except as provided in this act, a court in connection with 4 any civil or criminal proceeding, the legislature, any agency or any other public body having the power of 5 contempt shall not hold in contempt any journalist for б asserting the privilege under W.S. 1-12-701. A grand jury 7 8 shall not request any court to hold any journalist in 9 contempt for asserting the privilege under W.S. 1-12-701. 10 11 (b) Any news information obtained in violation of the privilege asserted under W.S. 1-12-701 is inadmissible in 12 13 any action, proceeding or hearing before the legislature, any court or any other agency or public body in the state. 14 15 16 (c) No fine, term of imprisonment or civil penalty 17 shall be imposed upon any journalist for asserting the privilege in accordance with W.S. 1-12-701. 18 19 20 1-12-703. Privileged communications; applicability. 21 22 (a) The privilege asserted under W.S. 1-12-701 23 applies notwithstanding whether:

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1 2 (i) A court, the legislature, any agency or any 3 other public body determines that the information is highly 4 relevant to a particular proceeding; or 5 б (ii) The information is published or otherwise 7 publicly released. 8 9 The privilege asserted under W.S. 1-12-701 shall (b) apply to any supervisor or employer having authority over 10 the journalist, including any faculty advisor, educational 11 12 institution, newspaper, magazine, radio station or television station. 13 14 1-12-704. Burden of proof. 15 16 17 Except as provided in W.S. 1-12-705(a)(ii) with respect to 18 defamation actions, in any action to compel disclosure of 19 news information, the journalist asserting a privilege 20 under W.S. 1-12-701 shall have the burden of proving the 21 existence of the privilege. 22 23 1-12-105. Exceptions allowing compelled disclosure.

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1 2 (a) There is no privilege under W.S. 1-12-701 if 3 either of the following conditions is met: 4 5 (i) Failure to disclose the news information will create an imminent risk of death or serious bodily б 7 harm; 8 9 (ii) In a defamation action where a person 10 seeking disclosure of news information which would 11 otherwise be privileged under W.S 1-12-701 can demonstrate that the news information will lead to evidence that is 12 relevant to an element of the defamation claim. 13 14 1-12-706. Waiver. 15 16 17 A journalist waives the privilege under W.S. 1-12-701 if the journalist voluntarily discloses or consents to 18 19 disclosure of the news information. 20 1-12-707. Definitions. 21 22 (a) As used in this act: 23

2 (i) "Journalist" means is any person who 3 professionally engaged in gathering, preparing, writing, 4 editing, filming, taping, photographing or broadcasting 5 news on a radio or television station licensed by the federal communications commission or for publication in or б with a newspaper, magazine, news media, press association, 7 8 wire service, website or other professional medium or agency that has as one of its principal functions the 9 10 and researching of news intended for processing 11 publication. "Journalist" includes any person who is an 12 employee of or who is otherwise affiliated with a medium or 13 agency that has as one of its principal functions the processing and researching of news intended for publication 14 and includes any student enrolled at the University of 15 16 Wyoming or a Wyoming community college who, regardless of 17 pay, otherwise meets the requirements of this paragraph; 18 19 (ii) "News information" means: 20 21 (A) Any written, oral, pictorial, photographic or electronically recorded information or 22

W.S. 7-11-403(a)(iii), (iv) and by 10 creating a new paragraph (v) is amended to read: 11 12 7-11-403. Applicability of rules and civil procedure 13 provisions. 14 (a) To the extent practicable and when not otherwise 15 16 specifically provided, the provisions of the Wyoming Rules 17 of Civil Procedure, the Wyoming Rules of Evidence and the Wyoming Code of Civil Procedure shall govern in criminal 18 19 cases, relative to: 20 21 (iii) Proceedings for contempt; and 22
