9	Section 1. W.S. 9-4-219 is amended to read:

14	(a) The legislative stabilization reserve account							
15	created by 2005 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 191, Section							

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1	4, Section 301(d) is continued and codified. Funds within							
2	the account shall only be expended by legislative							
3	appropriation The account shall consist of those funds							
4	appropriated or designated by law and the balance of the							
5	account as of the end of a fiscal biennium shall not exceed							
6	the total of all general fund appropriations authorized for							
7	expenditure during the same fiscal biennium. To the extent							
8	any deposit of funds to the account would exceed this							
9	limitation, excess funds shall be credited to the general							
10	fund. All funds within the account shall be invested by							
11	the state treasurer and all investment earnings from the							
12	account shall be credited to the general fund.
