A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the capitol building rehabilitation project; amending provisions related to project oversight 2 3 components; eliminating project components and specified; providing duties and authority to the state 4 5 building commission; eliminating the capitol building rehabilitation and restoration oversight group and related 6 7 provisions; providing definitions; modifying a definition; imposing limitations on expenditures; transferring funds as 8 9 specified; repealing an appropriation; requiring the 10 development of a project budget; requiring a report; 11 repealing provisions related to interfund borrowing, 12 repayment of borrowed funds and other superseded 13 provisions; and providing for an effective date.

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15 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 2 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-5-109(j), (k) and (o),

The project shall proceed as a single funded project with the following components: 6 7 8 (i) Capitol building restoration and rehabilitation necessary to continue the use of the capitol 9 10 building as the seat of the Wyoming government, which shall 11 only include repairs and modifications necessary to: 12 13 (A) Update life safety systems in the 14 capitol building; 15 16 (B) Repair defective or deteriorating 17 structural features, both on the interior and exterior of 18 the capitol building, including the foundation, as 19 necessary to protect the state's asset in the state capitol 20 building;

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5	(D) Provide necessary technological and
6	communication system upgrades; and
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8	(E) Comply with any applicable building
9	codes and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42

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12	(v) Furniture, fixtures and equipment <u>necessary</u>

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20	(b) The level III design shall allocate space within
21	the capitol building to meet legislative needs, needs of
22	the governor's office, provide an office for each statewide
23	elected official, a deputy and a secretary housed in the

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capitol building as of July 1, 2015 and security needs in 1 2 the capitol building as determined by the oversight group and the governor state building commission. In determining 3 4 space allocations under this subsection the oversight group and the governor state building commission shall be guided 5 by level II studies for the capitol building restoration 6 and rehabilitation conducted in 2013. To the extent the 7 8 oversight group and the governor determine state building commission determines that all such needs cannot be 9 accommodated within the capitol building, legislative 10 committee rooms and offices for committee chairmen and 11 12 associated legislative session staff may be within the 13 structure connecting buildings in close proximity to the capitol building. and Herschler state office building. If 14 15 the governor and the oversight group determine that space 16 will exist in the capitol building in excess of the needs of the legislature, the governor's office and capitol 17 building security needs, then the department, in 18 19 consultation with the advisory task force, shall provide 20 one (1) or more design alternatives to the oversight group 21 and governor for review and approval, allocating available remaining space to the statewide elected officials with 22 23 offices within the capitol building as of April 1, 2014.

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1 2 (e) No funds shall be expended for the purposes of 3 construction until: 4 5 (i) A budget for the project has been submitted and approved by the state building commission; and 6 7 8 (ii) Final design plans for the project have been submitted to the advisory task force for review and 9 10 comment and to the governor and the oversight group state 11 building commission for review and a majority of the 12 legislative members of the oversight group members of the 13 state building commission has recommended approval and the 14 governor has approved the plans. 15 16 As provided in this subsection, the department (f) may expend funds appropriated by the legislature for the 17 project to implement the design, renovation, restoration, 18 19 rehabilitation, construction and other project components 20 which have been included in the final design plans approved 21 under subsection (e) of this section. No funds shall be 22 expended for any purpose related to the Herschler state

office building or any other purpose not related to the

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project. Any change order to the approved final design 1 2 plans in excess of one hundred thousand dollars 3 (\$100,000.00) or in a cumulative amount in excess of one 4 million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall require the approval 5 of a majority of the legislative members of the oversight 6 group and the governor members of the state building commission. The department, in consultation with the 7 8 professional program manager, architect of record and 9 construction manager at risk, shall develop a budget to 10 implement the project as provided in W.S. 9-5-110 through 11 9-5-113. The department shall present the budget to the 12 state building commission not later than July 1, 2016. Any 13 contract related to the state capitol building 14 rehabilitation project executed after April 1, 2016 shall conform to the contracting requirements provided by title 15 16 16, chapter 6 of Wyoming statutes, article 3, section 31 of the Wyoming Constitution, W.S. 9-2-1027 through 9-2-1033 17 and rules adopted pursuant to W.S. 9-2-1016. Additionally, 18 19 a contract shall be awarded only if at least three (3) 20 responsible bids have been considered by the department. 21 The department may award a contract after having considered 22 less than (3) responsible bids only upon reasonable effort 23 to solicit additional bids.

Capitol building rehabilitation project; 2 3 design and construction execution. 4 5 (a) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-5-101 through 9-5-108, for all components of the project: 6 7 8 (iii) In addition to those items required by law 9 to be presented to the advisory task force for advice, as recommended by the oversight group state building 10 11 commission and directed by the governor, the department 12 shall consult with the advisory task force on other project 13 items as the project progresses. 14 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-5-110(a)(iii), 9-5-111, 15 16 9-5-112(a)(ii), (iv), (c) and (d), 2014 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 40, Section 4(c), (d) and (e) are repealed. 17 18 19 Section 3. Nothing in this act shall be construed to 20 modify obligations of the state of Wyoming under contracts 21 with private parties executed prior to the effective date

of this act except to the extent necessitated by the

1 reduction in the scope of the state capitol building

2 rehabilitation project.

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4 Section 4. Funds within the capitol building rehabilitation account shall remain in effect until the 5 project as defined in W.S. 9-5-112 is completed. Funds in 6 this account shall be expended only for the purposes 7 8 specified, and any unused funds remaining at project completion shall be transferred to the school capital 9 construction account. The amounts appropriated to this 10 11 account shall not be construed to be an entitlement or 12 quaranteed amount.

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Section 5. Any unencumbered, unexpended, unobligated funds which are deposited in the capitol building rehabilitation account created as a result of legislation enacted during the 2016 session shall be transferred to the school capital construction account.

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1 Section 6. This act is effective immediately upon

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 3

4 Constitution.
