Attorney general-government efficiency and fraud division.

## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the administration of government;

2 creating the division of fraud and government efficiency

3 within the office of the attorney general; establishing the

4 duties of the division; providing rulemaking authority;

5 providing a sunset date; requiring a report; prohibiting

6 retaliatory employment practices as specified; making an

7 appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-1-641 through 9-1-645 are created

12 to read:

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- 9-1-641. Division of fraud and government efficiency;
- 2 created; appointment of administrator; employees;
- 3 definitions.

- 5 (a) The division of fraud and government efficiency
- 6 is created within the office of the attorney general.

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- 8 (b) In consultation with the attorney general, the
- 9 governor shall appoint an administrator who is the chief
- 10 administrative officer of the division. The governor shall
- 11 consider and give weight to the appointment of an attorney
- 12 to be administrator. The administrator is responsible to
- 13 the attorney general for the operation of the division.
- 14 Once appointed, the administrator shall serve a term of six
- 15 (6) years but may be removed by the governor pursuant to
- 16 W.S. 9-1-202.

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- 18 (c) With the consent of the attorney general and the
- 19 governor, and subject to legislative appropriation, the
- 20 administrator may employ investigative, administrative and
- 21 other specialized personnel necessary to carry out the

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22 functions of the division.

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1 (d) As used in this act: 2 3 (i) "Administrator" means the administrator of 4 the division; 5 (ii) "Division" means the division of fraud and 6 government efficiency within the office of the attorney 7 8 general; 9 (iii) "Inefficient," "inefficiency" 10 11 "inefficiencies" means conduct or practices which increase the cost of operating state government or providing a state 12 13 government service beyond reasonable and customary costs, or beyond the costs which would be incurred if the service 14 15 or operation was provided after using reasonably available 16 means to reduce costs, and includes waste, fraud or abuse by a government employee; 17 18 19 (iv) "This act" means W.S. 9-1-641 through 20 9-1-645. 21 22 9-1-642. Division of fraud and government efficiency; 23 duties of administrator.

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2	(a) The administrator shall:
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4	(i) Supervise and direct all activities of the
5	division;
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7	(ii) Report to the attorney general regarding
8	all functions of the division, including findings of
9	inefficiencies and substantiated and unsubstantiated claims
10	of inefficiencies;
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12	(iii) Serve as a liaison with state agencies,
13	other branches of state government, state employees, the
14	federal government and local governmental entities for the
15	purpose of identifying inefficiencies and any related
16	criminal conduct;
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18	(iv) Upon the identification or report of an
19	inefficiency, investigate the inefficiency and, if the
20	inefficiency is verified by the investigation, design a
21	plan of action reasonably likely to terminate the

22 inefficiency. A plan may include recommendations for the

1 prosecution or discipline of a government employee or other

2 person;

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(v) Submit plans developed pursuant to paragraph

(iv) of this subsection to the governor and the attorney

general for review. No plan shall be implemented without

the approval of the governor and, upon approval by the

governor, the plan shall be implemented only as consistent

with the regular powers of the officers, employees and

officials executing the plan;

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12 (vi) In addition to submitting plans as required 13 by paragraph (v) of this subsection, report at least 14 quarterly verified instances of government inefficiency and 15 substantiated and unsubstantiated claims of inefficiency to 16 the attorney general, the governor and the legislature's 17 management council. The report shall not identify by name 18 any person who has made a report of an inefficiency and 19 shall redact all information that, in the judgement of the 20 administrator with approval from the attorney general, 21 would unduly harm any person, impede a current 22 investigation or that would not serve the best interests of 23 the state or the efficiency related purposes of this act.

- 1 The report shall not contain any information withheld from
- 2 public inspection pursuant to W.S. 9-1-644. The report may
- 3 contain recommendations for any legislative action
- 4 necessary to accomplish a plan developed and approved
- 5 pursuant to paragraphs (iv) and (v) of this subsection.

- 7 9-1-643. Division of fraud and government efficiency;
- 8 duties and responsibilities.

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- 10 (a) The division of fraud and government efficiency
- 11 shall:

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- (i) Administer a comprehensive statewide plan
- 14 to:

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- 16 (A) Promote efficiency in the operation of
- 17 state government;

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- 19 (B) Review the configuration of Wyoming
- 20 state government and the duties and responsibilities of

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21 state agencies to identify inefficiencies;

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1 (C) Promote the reporting of inefficiencies 2 by state, federal and local government employees and by the 3 public, including the promotion of reporting protection 4 awareness in compliance with W.S. 9-11-103(d); 5 (D) Provide assistance to state agencies, 6 other branches of state government and state and federal 7 8 employees to identify inefficiencies and related criminal conduct. 9 10 11 (ii) Maintain a telephone and on-line system 12 where state employees, federal government employees, local 13 government employees and members of the public can report 14 inefficiencies in the operation of state government. The 15 identity of any person making a report on the telephone or 16 on-line system shall be kept confidential to the extent 17 The system may allow anonymous reasonably possible. 18 reporting and shall endeavor to allow fully identified 19 reporting under the employment protections provided by W.S. 20 9-11-103; 21 (iii) Subject to the approval of the attorney 22

general, promulgate rules and regulations necessary to

- 1 execute the duties and responsibilities assigned to the
- 2 administrator and the division by this act.

4 9-1-644. Confidentiality of records.

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- 6 All records and information collected and generated
- 7 pursuant to this act which are not already matters of
- 8 public record are investigation records and may be withheld
- 9 from public inspection pursuant to W.S. 16-4-203(b)(i).

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11 **9-1-645**. Sunset.

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13 This act is repealed effective July 1, 2024.

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- 15 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-11-103(a) by creating a new
- 16 paragraph (vi) and (b) is amended to read:

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- 18 9-11-103. Discrimination against certain employees
- 19 prohibited; civil action against employer.

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- 21 (a) No state employer may discharge, discipline or
- 22 retaliate against an employee by unreasonably altering the
- 23 terms, location or conditions of employment because the

employee acting in good faith and within the scope of 1 2 duties of employment: 3 4 (iv) Participates or is requested to participate 5 in any investigation, hearing or inquiry; or 6 7 (v) Has refused to carry out a directive which 8 is beyond the scope, terms and conditions of his employment that would expose the employee or any individual to a 9 10 condition likely to result in serious injury or death, 11 after having sought and been unable to obtain a correction 12 of the dangerous condition from the employer; - or 13 14 (vi) Submits a report to the attorney general's 15 fraud and government efficiency division on-line or 16 telephone reporting system, operated pursuant to W.S. 9-1-643(a)(ii). No employee submitting a report to the 17 18 attorney general's fraud and government efficiency division 19 on-line or telephone reporting system shall be required to 20 comply with the provisions of subsection (b) of this 21 section as a condition of receiving the protections 22 provided by this subsection.

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1 Except as provided by paragraph (a) (vi) of this (b) 2 section, subsection (a) of this section does not apply to 3 an employee who has reported or caused to be reported a 4 violation or unsafe condition or practice, unless the 5 employee has first brought the alleged violation, condition or practice to the attention of a person having supervisory 6 authority over the employee and has allowed the state 7 8 employer a reasonable opportunity to correct that violation, condition or practice. Prior notice to a person 9 having supervisory authority is not required if the 10 11 employee reasonably believes that the report may not result 12 in prompt correction of the violation, condition In such cases, the employee shall report the 13 practice. violation, condition or practice to the department 14 15 agency director of the state entity with which he 16 employed or to the office of the governor. In the event the 17 alleged violation, condition or practice occurred within the office of the governor, the employee may report the 18 19 violation, condition or practice to the office of the 20 secretary of state.

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22 **Section 3.** There is appropriated eight hundred 23 thousand dollars (\$800,000.00) from the legislative

stabilization reserve account to the office of the attorney 1 2 This appropriation shall be for the period 3 beginning with the effective date of this act and ending 4 June 30, 2020. This appropriation shall only be expended for the purpose of establishing the division of fraud and 5 government efficiency within the office of the attorney 6 general and recruiting and hiring one (1) administrator, 7 8 two (2) investigators and one (1) office support person for the purpose of conducting the duties of the division of 9 10 fraud and government efficiency as established by this act. 11 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this 12 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds 13 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided 14 by law on June 30, 2020. This appropriation shall be 15 16 included in the attorney general's 2021-2022 standard biennial budget request. 17

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Section 4. Not earlier than July 1, 2023 and not later than January 1, 2024, the governor shall submit a report to the joint appropriations committee and the legislature's management council. The report shall disclose whether the state of Wyoming has realized benefits

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from the operation of W.S. 9-1-641 through 9-1-644 in 1 excess of the legislative appropriations, and any other 2 3 funding, used to operate the division of fraud and 4 government efficiency created by this act. The legislature may use the report to determine whether the division of 5 fraud and government efficiency should be allowed to sunset 6 as provided by W.S. 9-1-645, created by this act. 7 8 9 Section 5. This act is effective July 1, 2018.
