11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

13 Section 1.

15 (a) As used in this act:

1 2 (i) "Appropriation" means the authorizations 3 granted by the legislature under this act to make 4 expenditures from and to incur obligations against the general and other funds as specified; 5 6 7 (ii) "FF" means federal funds; 8 9 (iii) "PR" means private funding sources; 10 11 (iv) "SR" means an agency's account within the 12 special revenue fund; 13 14 (v) "S13" means the strategic investments and 15 projects account. 16 17 (b) Appropriations for projects in this act remain in effect until the project is completed, unless otherwise 18 19 provided. The amounts appropriated for projects under this 20 act shall be expended only on the projects specified and 21 any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining upon completion of a project shall revert as provided by law. The amounts 22

appropriated in this act are intended to provide a maximum

14 (ii) Closely monitor the procurement of

15 professional services and progress on the Casper state

16 office building project;

18 (iii) When necessary or prudent, make

19 recommendations to the state construction department

20 regarding important aspects of the Casper state office

21 building project;

1 (iv) Closely monitor and make recommendations to

2 the state construction department and any entity procured

3 for professional services on all aspects of the meeting

4 rooms and facilities located within the Casper state office

5 building project that are designed to accommodate meetings

6 of joint interim committees of the legislature in

7 accordance with 2018 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 136,

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11 (v) Provide interim reports on the activities of

12 the task force to the joint appropriations committee not

13 later than November 1 of each year the task force is in

14 existence;

17 of the meeting rooms and facilities referenced in paragraph

18 (iv) of this subsection and any recommendations for

19 legislative action that should be considered during the

20 legislative session immediately following the report as

21 necessary to continue or complete the Casper state office

22 building project.

1 (e) The task force shall be staffed by the state 2 construction department with assistance provided by the 3 legislative service office. In staffing the task force, the 4 state construction department shall: 5 (i) Coordinate and 6 schedule all meetings, assemble all required meeting agenda and meeting materials 7 8 for the task force and include and communicate with the 9 legislative service office to allow the legislative service 10 office to provide sufficient assistance to the legislative members to fulfill their responsibilities as members of the 11 12 task force; 13 (ii) Act as a liaison between the task force and 14 15 the executive branch of government to communicate task 16 force recommendations; 17 18 (iii) Provide regular updates and 19 reports to the task force and the state building commission 20 concerning the Casper state office building project;

22 (iv) Provide other information and assistance to 23 the task force as requested.

(f) Members of the task force who are legislators shall be paid salary, per diem and mileage in the amount and manner provided for members of an interim committee under W.S. 28-5-101 and 28-5-102 when performing official duties as members of the task force. The cochairmen of the task force shall be eligible for salary as provided under W.S. 28-5-101(e)(i).

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10 (g) Except as otherwise provided in this section, 11 nonlegislative members of the task force shall 12 without salary but shall be paid expenses in the amount and manner provided for state employees under W.S. 9-3-102 and 13 9-3-103 when performing official duties as members of the 14 task force. Nonlegislative members of the task force who 15 16 state employees shall be considered on official 17 business of the state when performing official duties as members of the task force, shall not be paid a separate 18 19 salary and shall be paid expenses in the amount and manner 20 provided by their agency.

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22 (h) The task force shall terminate sixty (60) days 23 after the substantial completion document for the project 1 is signed by the project architect, contractor and owner

2 and filed with the state construction department.

4 (j) There is appropriated ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) from the strategic investments and projects 5 legislative service 6 account to the office. appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the 7 8 effective date of this section and ending the month 9 following termination of the task force. This appropriation 10 shall only be expended for the purpose of funding salary, mileage and per diem of legislative members of the task 11 12 force. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this 13 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds 14 15 remaining from this appropriation after termination of the

18 (k) There is appropriated ten thousand dollars 19 (\$10,000.00) from the strategic investments and projects 20 account to the state construction department. 21 appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this section and ending the month 22 23 following termination of the task force.
