1 All individual or group health insurance policies providing coverage on an expense incurred basis, individual 2 3 and group service or indemnity type health insurance 4 contracts issued by any insurer, including any nonprofit 5 corporation and individual and group service contracts issued by a health maintenance organization, shall provide 6 coverage for the treatment of mental illness that is no 7 less extensive than the coverage provided for any other 8 9 physical illness. Private third party payors shall not

As used in this section, "mental illness" means 12 (b) 13 an illness which is diagnosed by a licensed psychiatrist or licensed clinical psychologist meeting criteria established 14 recent edition of the 15 in the most diagnostic statistical manual of mental disorders published by the 16 17 American Psychiatric Association.
