A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to education; prohibiting the university
2 and community colleges from requiring remedial classes as
3 specified; and providing for an effective date.

5 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-17-105 by creating a new
8 subsection (e), 21-18-205(a)(i) and by creating a new
9 paragraph (iii) and 21-18-307 are amended to read:

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11 **21-17-105. Tuition to be as nearly free as possible;**
12 **number, qualifications and selection of students for**
13 **reduced tuition; reciprocal residency; remedial classes.**

1 (e) Any student graduating from a high school in this
2 state shall not be required by the university to enroll in
3 a remedial class not credited toward a degree.

5 **21-18-205. Appropriation and distribution of state**
6 **funds; restrictions; budget authority.**

7
8 (a) To qualify for state funding, a community college
9 shall:

10
11 (i) Be accredited academically by the regional
12 accrediting agency;~~and~~

14 (iii) Be in compliance with W.S. 21-18-307.

15
16 **21-18-307. Admission of state high school graduates**
17 **without examination; remedial classes.**

18
19 (a) A person who graduates from a high school in this
20 state shall be admitted to a community college of this
21 state without further qualifying examination.

22
23 (b) Within three (3) years from the date of high
24 school graduation, any student graduating from a high

1 school in this state shall not be required by a community
2 college to enroll in a remedial class not credited toward a
3 degree or certificate. In computing the three (3) year
4 period under this subsection, exceptions shall be made for
5 military or religious service.

6

7 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2014.
