1 AN ACT relating to public lands; requiring transfer of

2 public lands; specifying distribution of proceeds from sale

3 of public lands; creating a joint select committee on the

4 transfer of public lands; providing duties of the

5 committee; providing definitions; providing legislative

6 findings; providing an appropriation; and providing for an

7 effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 36-12-201 and 36-12-202 are created

15 TRANSFER OF FEDERAL PUBLIC LANDS

1 2 36-12-201. Definitions. 3 4 (a) As used in this article: 5 (i) "Governmental entity" means any federal, 6 state, local or other governmental unit, subdivision, 7 8 agency, department or instrumentality thereof; 9 10 (ii) "Net proceeds" means the proceeds from the 11 sale of public lands, after subtracting expenses incident 12 to the sale of the public lands; 13 14 (iii) "Public lands" means lands within the exterior boundaries of Wyoming, except: 15 16 17 (A) Lands to which title is held by a 18 person who is not a governmental entity; 19 20 (B) Lands owned or held in trust by the 21 state, a political subdivision of the state or an 22 independent entity;

1 (C) Lands reserved for use by the state system of public education or a state institution of higher 3 education; 4 5 (D) School and institutional trust lands; 6 (E) The following national parks and other 7 8 areas: 9 (I) Yellowstone National Park; 10 11 12 (II) Grand Teton National Park; 13 14 (III) John D. Rockefeller, Jr. 15 Memorial Parkway; 16 17 (IV) Bighorn Canyon National 18 Recreation Area; 19 20 (V) Devils Tower National Monument; 21 22 (VI) Fort Laramie National Historic 23 Site; and

1 2 (VII) Fossil Butte National Monument. 3 (F) Any other lands within the exterior 4 boundaries of Wyoming as of January 1, 2021, that are 5 managed by the United States as a national park, designated 6 7 national monument or wilderness area designated under the 8 national wilderness preservation system; 9 10 (G) Real property or tangible personal 11 property owned by the United States if the property is 12 within the boundaries of a municipality; 13 14 (H) Any lands managed or owned by any branch of the United States military or the United States 15 16 department of energy; or 17 18 (J) Lands, including water rights, 19 belonging to an Indian or Indian tribe, band or community 20 that is held in trust by the United States or is subject to

a restriction against alienation imposed by the United

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States.

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3	(a) On or before December 31, 2023, the United States
4	shall:
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6	(i) Extinguish title to all public lands; and
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8	(ii) Transfer title to public lands to the state
9	of Wyoming.
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11	(b) If the state subsequently transfers title to any
12	public lands received under subsection (a) of this section,
13	the state shall:
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15	(i) Retain five percent (5%) of the net proceeds
16	the state receives from the transfer of title; and

18	(ii) Transfer ninety-five percent (95%) of the
19	net proceeds the state receives from the transfer of title
20	to the United States.

23	constitution, the amount the state retains in accordance

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7 (a) There is created a joint select committee on the

8 transfer of public lands, with members as follows:

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10 (i) The speaker of the house of representatives

11 shall appoint not more than three (3) members from the

12 majority party and not less than one (1) member from the

13 minority party of the house of representatives; and

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15 (ii) The president of the senate shall appoint

16 not more than three (3) members from the majority party and

17 not less than one (1) member from the minority party of the

18 senate.

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20 (b) The committee shall choose its chair or cochairs

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21 from among its membership.

1 (c) The committee shall, with guidance from other interested parties and stakeholders, prepare proposed 2 3 legislation: 4 (i) Creating a public lands commission assigned 5 to: 6 7 8 (A) Administer the transfer of title of public lands to the state under W.S. 36-12-202; and 9 10 11 (B) Address the management of public lands and the management of multiple uses of public lands 12 including recognizing all existing rights to use of the 13 14 public lands. 15 16 (ii) Establishing actions that shall be taken to 17 secure, preserve and protect the state's rights and benefits related to the United States' duty to have 18 extinguished title to public lands under W.S. 36-12-202 in 19

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8 (h) Members of the joint select committee on the

9 transfer of public lands shall be paid salary, per diem and

10 mileage as provided in W.S. 28-5-101 for their official

11 duties as members of the select committee.

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13 Section 3.

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15 (a) The legislature finds that federal funding and

16 the resulting capacity for responsible management of

17 federal public lands are in serious jeopardy while critical

18 threats such as beetle kills, invasive species, watershed

19 degradation, access restrictions and catastrophic wildfires

20 continue to escalate.

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22 (b) The legislature further finds that the enabling

23 act creating the state of Wyoming includes specific

provisions for the disposal of public lands and guarantees

admittance into the union on equal footing with all other

states. Wyoming, like other western states,

4 received the full benefit of the provisions of the enabling act, related to the disposal of lands from the federal 5 government. More specifically, section 7 of the act of 6 admission requires "Five percent of the proceeds of the 7 8 sales of public lands lying within said state which shall 9 be sold by the United States subsequent to the admission of 10 said state into the union, after deducting all the expenses 11 incident to the same, shall be paid to the state, to be 12 used as a permanent fund, the interest of which only shall 13 be expended in support of the common schools within said 14 state."

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Section 4. There is appropriated twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative service office. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2023. This appropriation shall only be expended for payment of salary, per diem and mileage for select committee members.

1 Section 5. This act is effective immediately upon

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
