- 1 AN ACT relating to water; requiring water produced from
- 2 geologic sequestration of carbon dioxide in saline aquifers
- 3 to be for a beneficial use as specified; and providing for

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 41-3-101 and 41-3-909(a) by creating
- 9 a new paragraph (xi) is amended to read:

11 41-3-101. Nature of water rights and beneficial use.

- 13 A water right is a right to use the water of the state,
- 14 when such use has been acquired by the beneficial
- 15 application of water under the laws of the state relating
- 16 thereto, and in conformity with the rules and regulations

1	dependent thereon. Beneficial use shall be the basis, the
2	measure and limit of the right to use water at all times,
3	not exceeding the statutory limit except as provided by
4	W.S. 41-4-317. In addition to any beneficial use specified
5	by law or rule and regulation promulgated pursuant thereto,
6	the use of water for the purpose of extracting heat
7	therefrom is considered a beneficial use subject to prior
8	rights. The production of water as a by-product of geologic
9	sequestration of carbon dioxide shall not constitute a
LO	beneficial use. Water being always the property of the
L1	state, rights to its use shall attach to the land for
L2	irrigation, or to such other purposes or object for which
L3	acquired in accordance with the beneficial use made for
L4	which the right receives public recognition, under the law
L5	and the administration provided thereby. Water rights for
L6	the direct use of the natural unstored flow of any stream
L7	cannot be detached from the lands, place or purpose for
L8	which they are acquired, except as provided in W.S.
L9	41-3-102 and 41-3-103, pertaining to a change to preferred
20	use, and except as provided in W.S. 41-4-514.

In the administration and enforcement of this act 1 2 and in the effectuation of the policy of the state to 3 conserve its underground water resources, the 4 engineer is authorized and empowered on advice and consent 5 of the board of control: 6 (xi) To require any person producing water from 7 geologic sequestration of carbon dioxide in saline aquifers 8 9 to adequately demonstrate that the water produced, unless reinjected below the surface or otherwise disposed of in 10 11 accordance with W.S. 35-11-101 et seq., will be put to a beneficial use beyond the mere production and shall seek a 12 permit under W.S. 41-3-904. 13 14 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon 15 16 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 17 provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the
