8	Section 1. W.S. 27-6-113 is amended to read:

10	27-6-113. Children; penalty for violations.

12	(a) Any person employing any child or children in
13	violation of the provisions of this act <u>chapter</u> , or any child,
14	subject hereto, who willfully and intentionally violates the
15	provisions of this act chapter, or any person who permits a

1	violation, <del>shall be deemed <u>is</u> guilty of a misdemeanor and</del>
2	upon conviction thereof, shall be <del>fined punished by a fine of</del>
3	not more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) <u>,</u> <del>or</del>
4	imprisoned in the county jail imprisonment for not more than
5	one hundred (100) days, or both <u>., in the discretion of the</u>
б	<del>court.</del>

8	(b) Nothing in this <del>act <u>chapter</u> applies to or prevents</del>
9	a child under fourteen (14) years of age to be employed in a
10	nonhazardous occupation outside of school hours by his
11	parents, grandparents or legal guardian, or by a business
12	owned by his parents, grandparents or legal guardian.
13	
14	Section 2. W.S. 27-6-116 is repealed.

16	Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2019.
